Cindi Wood, a Kings Mountain teacher for 16 years and now founder of Creative Dimensions, led "Communication Skills," for Kings Mountain District School secretaries Monday at Central School.

"We all have our individual behavioral styles," said Wood, who pointed out that personal style can prevent meaningful communication with others.

Workshop participants determined individual styles of behavior, learned to best communicate with others based on their style of

behavior, diffused potential arguments with co-workers, and learned how to become more effective in dealing with co-workers and how to appreciate the differences of others in the workplace.

Vivian Duncan, who chaired the workshop sessions, said the communications program is one of the three most popular programs that Wood has given to a wide variety of audiences. The others are "The Frazzled Female - Team Building; and "Stress Management."

Wood collaborated with bestselling author Marabel Morgan to develop a seminar series for work-

ing women which has been a focal point for state and area conferences.

Wood is also on the teaching staff of Kingdom Youth Conferences in Orlando, Fla. and has challenged professional educators from NC to Iowa with her creative approach to working with students in the classroom. She is a member of the National Speakers Association.
