Grover is currently buying close to half what they use from Kings Mountain, according to Ollis.

Ollis, reporting to the local utilities commission, reported that a minor seepage at the Davidson Lake dam has been fixed and that a Scotland Drive water line has been replaced.

Members discussed the need for repairs at the Deal Street swimming pool so that it could open during the summer but no action was taken and no concrete plans

Gas Supt. Jimmy Maney presented a petition from Woodbark Lane residents for natural gas and Planning Director Steve Killian updated the proposed subdivision changes and how they would affect the city utility extensions.

Ollis also presented a proposed contract for emergency water between Kings Mountain to the Cleveland County Sanitary District and said it awaits signatures of City Council as soon as the cost is determined after budget deliberations by Council.

City Manager Gary Hicks proposed an agreement for priority utility customers which would mean that people who are on life support systems and have difficulty paying their utility bills would not have their power cut off for non-


