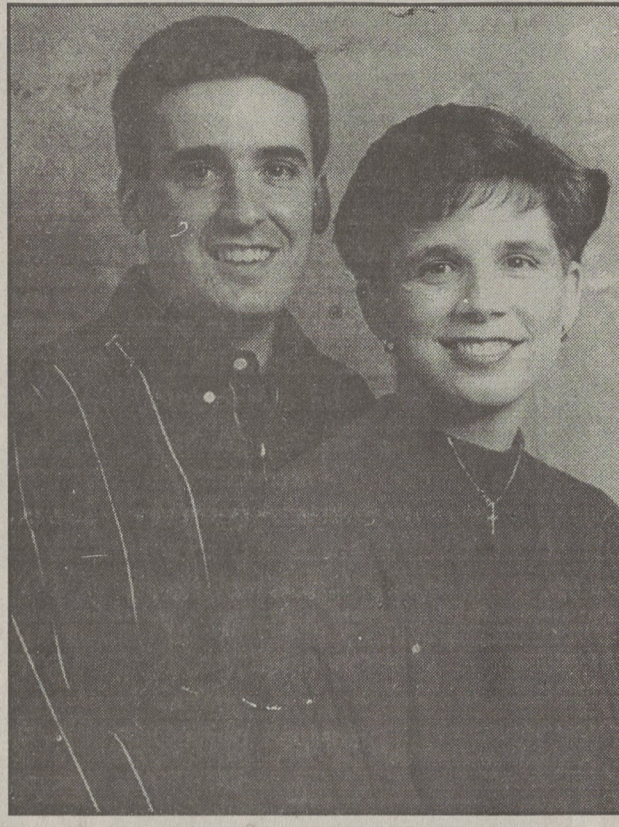
Scarborough-Ayscue

Spectrum drops in "100" ranking

Spectrum Dyed Yarns Inc. dropped 11 positions in rank, from No. 32 in 1995 to No. 43 in 1996, in the ranking of North Carolina's largest closely held 100 companies by Arthur Andersen, which reported total revenues for the 1996 North Carolina 100 increased six percent to \$15.7 billion, up from \$14.7 billion in 1994.

The report showed, however, a three percent decrease in overall employment of the 100 companies from 1995.

The Charlotte company ranks responding companies according to their 1995 year-end revenues. This year marks the 13th year of the list.

Parkdale Mills Inc. of Gastonia, which also operates a Kings Mountain plant, continued to hold its 1995 ranking position of No. 4.
