JV Mountaineers edge Gaffney 12-6

Kings Mountain High's JV football team posted its first win of the season Thursday night at Gamble Stadium, 12-6 over Gaffney's Indians.

The Mountaineers, 1-1, travel to Maiden Thursday at 7 p.m.

Kings Mountain took a 6-0 lead on its first offensive play when Cornelius Matthews returned a Gaffney punt 60 yards for a touchdown.

The Mountaineers missed a couple other scoring opportunities in the first half, twice driving inside the Gaffney 15 before losing the ball. The Mounties coughed up a fumble late in the first quarter, and the halftime clock ran out on their other drive.

Gaffney tied the score at 6-all in the third quarter on a 36-yard touchdown run by Joseph

The Kings Mountain defense held Gaffney on downs at the KM 40 midway of the fourth quarter, and the Mountaineers drove for the winning touchdown. Anthony Hillman scored from 13 yards out.

The Yellow Jackets got their final touchdown in the third quarter when lineman Nick Ledford scooped up a fumble and raced 50 yards into the end zone. And, the Mountaineers tacked on a safety when they tackled Hatten in the end zone in the fourth quarter.

"We had talked all week about getting out on top early," said Massey. "But we didn't anticipate jumping out quite that much. But we were happy to see that.'

The Mountaineers were just one point shy of the school record of 59 points in a season

In fact, the Mountaineers had the ball for only 35 running plays - 20 by reserves. KM's starting backs - McClain, Jones and Smith - carried the ball only 15 times and combined for 177 yards. The reserve backs included one (Garner) who was seeing his first action of the year, and another (reserve linebacker Toby Sims) who had not been in the backfield since last year when he was on the JV team.

"It enabled us to look at some


knowing that we have an open date this week," he added. "You really want to get a good game in before an open date.'
