Children of veterans may get scholarships

The North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs reminds high school seniors and other interested parties of the ongoing State Scholarship Program for children of certain disabled, deceased or POW/MIA veterans. Scholarships may be used at North Carolina colleges which are state-owned institutions of higher education, community colleges and technical institutes; or privately-owned, nonprofit colleges and universi-

Scholarships, with one exception, provide free tuition, certain fees, and room and board allowances in state-owned institutions and \$4,500 per academic year in private institutions. The exception is that awards under the 100% service-connected disability provision provide free tuition and certain fees in stateowned institutions and \$1,500 per academic year in private institutions. All awards are for four academic yeas in duration which must be used within 10 yeas from the date of the award.




