Sidney Crocker had a big game with four points and four assists, Burris had two steals and Jawan McCree blocked three shots.

The Mountaineers weren't up to par defensively and at the foul line. KM hit only 34 percent of its free throws (8 of 22) while Burns hit 56 percent (10 of 18).



Kings Mountain got off to a slow start in the girls game and dropped a 53-48 decision despite playing a tremendous second half.

Burns led 25-15 at intermission but Kings Mountain came back to cut the margin to 34-32 at the end of the third quarter. The Lady Mountaineers took the lead with four minutes to play but Burns iced the game at the foul line.

"We played them close the second half," said Coach Tony Leigh. "If we had played four quarters like we did the third and fourth it would have been a different ball game."
