Kings Mountain High's men's track team, one of the largest in history of the school, will open its season Thursday at 4 p.m. at John Gamble STadium against North Gaston, Shelby and South Point.

Veteran Coach John Bumgardner had over 60 people show up for the first day of practice, and most of them are still with the team.

'We have a lot of young kids," says Bumgardner, "but we have as large a number as we've every had. The kids seem to be real interested and I think the weather has helped too. We've been fortunate to have some good weather."

The Mountaineers have some outstanding performers returning and should be among the best in the conference in the sprints.

Senior Corey Jones finished fifth in the state last year in the 100-meter dash and he should be ready for another outstanding season. He and Marcus Smith also were members of the 4 x 100 meter relay team which finished fifth in the state.

Bumgardner looks for Shelby and East Rutherford, who finished 1-2 last year, to be strong again.

'East Rutherford was real young last year and will have a lot of people back, and Shelby is always god," he said. "We hope to give them a pretty good run for it. I think we'll be in the top three again if everybody does what they're supposed to do."

Bumgardner welcomes the addition of three men to the coaching staff. Working with the sprinters are Diron Bell and D.J. Williams, who are former Mountaineers now employed at Parker Street School; and working with the long and triple jumpers is Calvin Wingo, another former Mountaineer track standout. Also on the coaching staff are Dave Farquharson and Aubrev Hollifield.

"We've got plenty of help and a lot of kids out, so maybe we can have a good year," Bumgardner said.

The Mountaineers managed only three hits off Crest pitcher Darius Pullen, who struck out 13. Crest managed only four hits off KM's David Clark but the Chargers took advantage of five walks to build a 2-0 lead after three innings. 
