Mounties win second track meet

Kings Mountain High's track team defeated South Point and Burns for their second straight victory in a Southwestern 3A Conference meet Thursday at Lineberger Stadium in Belmont. Kings Mountain scored 113 points to South Point's 46 and Burns' 12.

The Mountaineers face their toughest challenge of the season Thursday, April 10 when they host Burns, East Rutherford and Shelby at 3:30 p.m. East and Shelby are regarded as the teams to beat in the SWC.

Kings Mountain got an outstanding effort from several individuals last week. Joseph Bell led the scoring with 12.25 points. Chad Pearson scored 11.25 and Anthony Ash 10.75.

Several individuals recorded their season high performances. Keyotta Huskey cleared 6'1" in the high jump, Harley Price soared 10 feet in the pole vault, Kareem Marshall threw the discus 124'7", Anthony Ash ran a 16.10 seconds in the 110 high hurdles, Chad Pearson ran the 1600 meters in 5:03.34 and the 3200 meters in 10:58.25, Lee Barnes ran the 200 in 23.53 seconds, Joseph Bell ran the 100 meters in 11.39 seconds, Bill Welsh ran the 1600 meters in six minutes, and Jeremy Reagan ran the 800 meters in 2:34.


