Rev. Eng receives doctorate, ordained

Rev. Robert William Eng III of Kings Mountain received his Doctorate of Theology May 25 from Jacksonville Theological Seminary, and was ordained at a special ceremony that evening.

Eng is a 1974 graduate of Kings Mountain High School. He entered the U.S. Army where he was an Airborne Ranger with 20 military schools upon leaving the military in 1980.

He received an Associate Degree in Industrial Management from Cleveland Community College along with an Associate Degree in Industrial Safety and Health in 1983.

He received his Bachelors Degree of Religious Arts in Biblical Studies in 1995 from Jacksonville Theological Seminary. Eng is currently working on his Ph.D. in Christian Counseling.

Eng has been self-employed in Kings Mountain for 20 years as owner of the Eng School of Self Defense. He has also been an Associate Pastor for five years.

Eng said he plans to open a Family Counseling Center in the future.

Dr. Eng and his wife, Susan, and daughter, Heather, reside in North Woodbridge at Moss Lake.

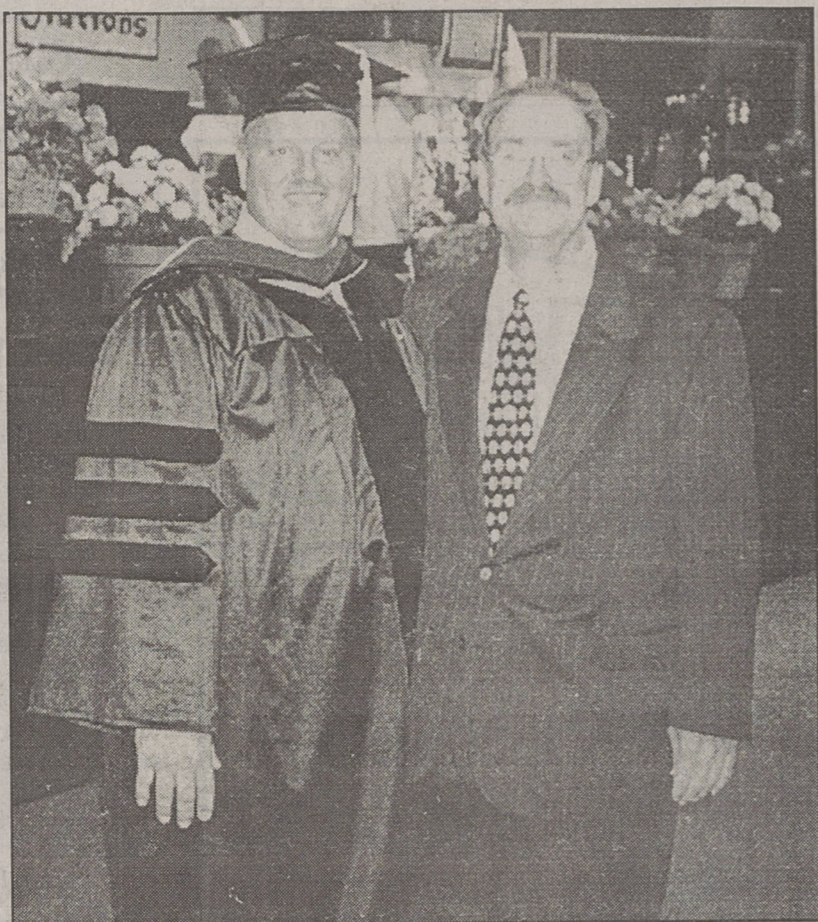
Cherokee Street Baptist Church will have a gospel singing Sunday, June 8 at 6 p.m.
