KM Rescue Squad gets grant for \$14,938

Kings Mountain Rescue Squad has received a matching state grant for \$14,983.88 from the Volunteer Rescue/EMS Grant Fund created by the General Assembly in 1988 to help rescue squads raise money for emergency response equipment and supplies.

Insurance Commissioner and State Fire Marshal Jim Long announced the grant. The check was presented to Chief Jonie Blanton by Deputy Commissioner of Insurance Charles Curtis.

"North Carolina is fortunate to have such a large number of dedicated fire and rescue volunteers and I am very pleased to assist their efforts," said Long. "These grants help volunteer EMS personnel provide essential services to their communities by allowing them to spend more time training in the latest lifesaving methods and less time fundraising."

During Commissioner Long's tenure in office his department has distributed a total of \$23,746,415 in grant money to fire and rescue units across the state. The total amount of volunteer rescue and fire grants approved for Cleveland County to date is \$236,784.

Area students make CCC President's List

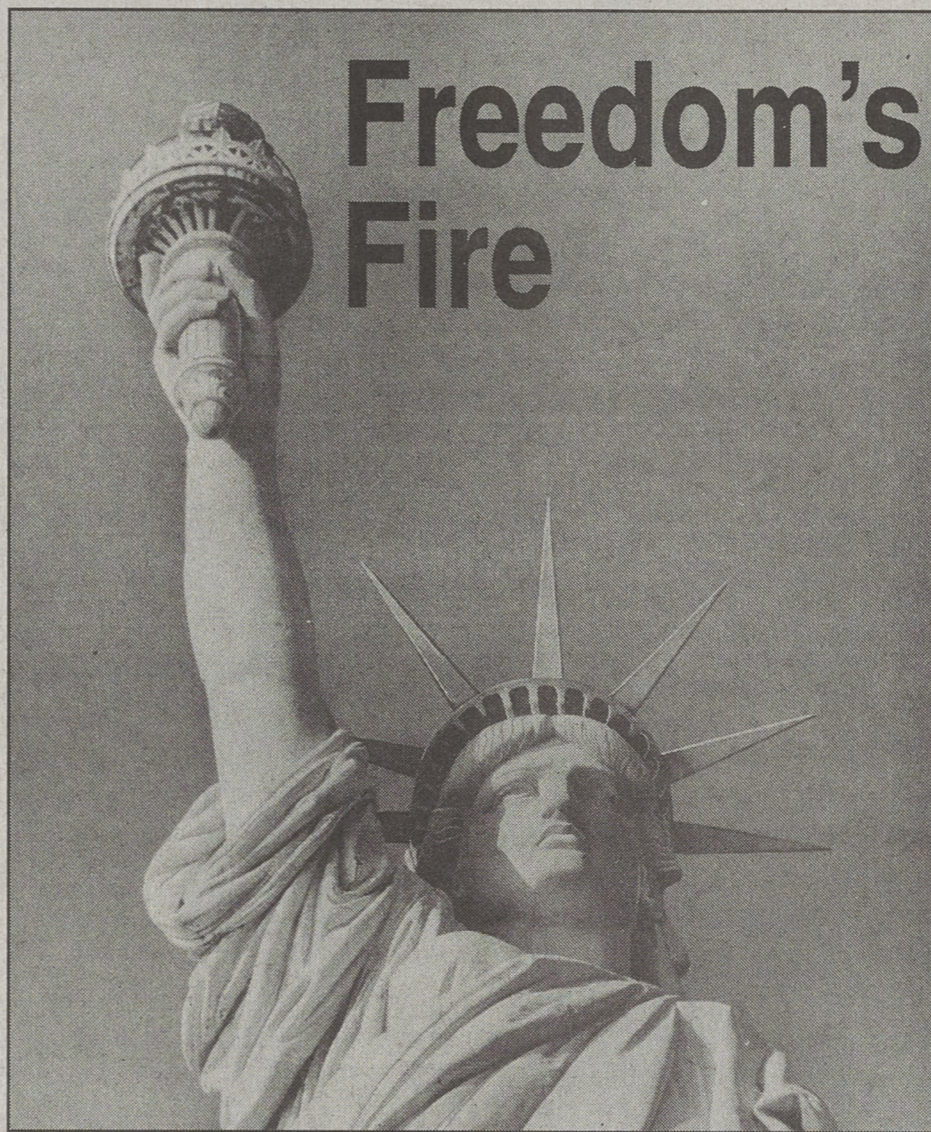
Five students from Grover and 22 from Kings Mountain are listed on the President's List for the Spring Quarter at Cleveland Community College.
