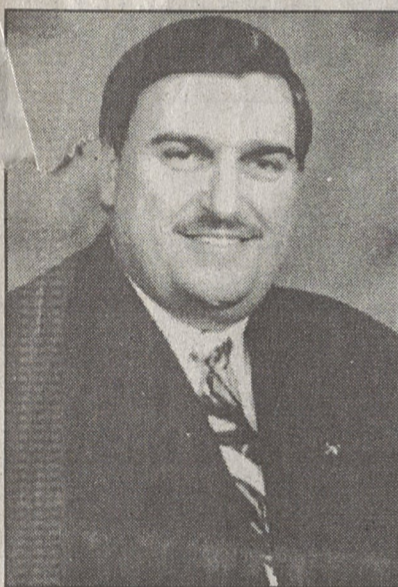
Vacation Bible School at Chestnut Ridge Baptist

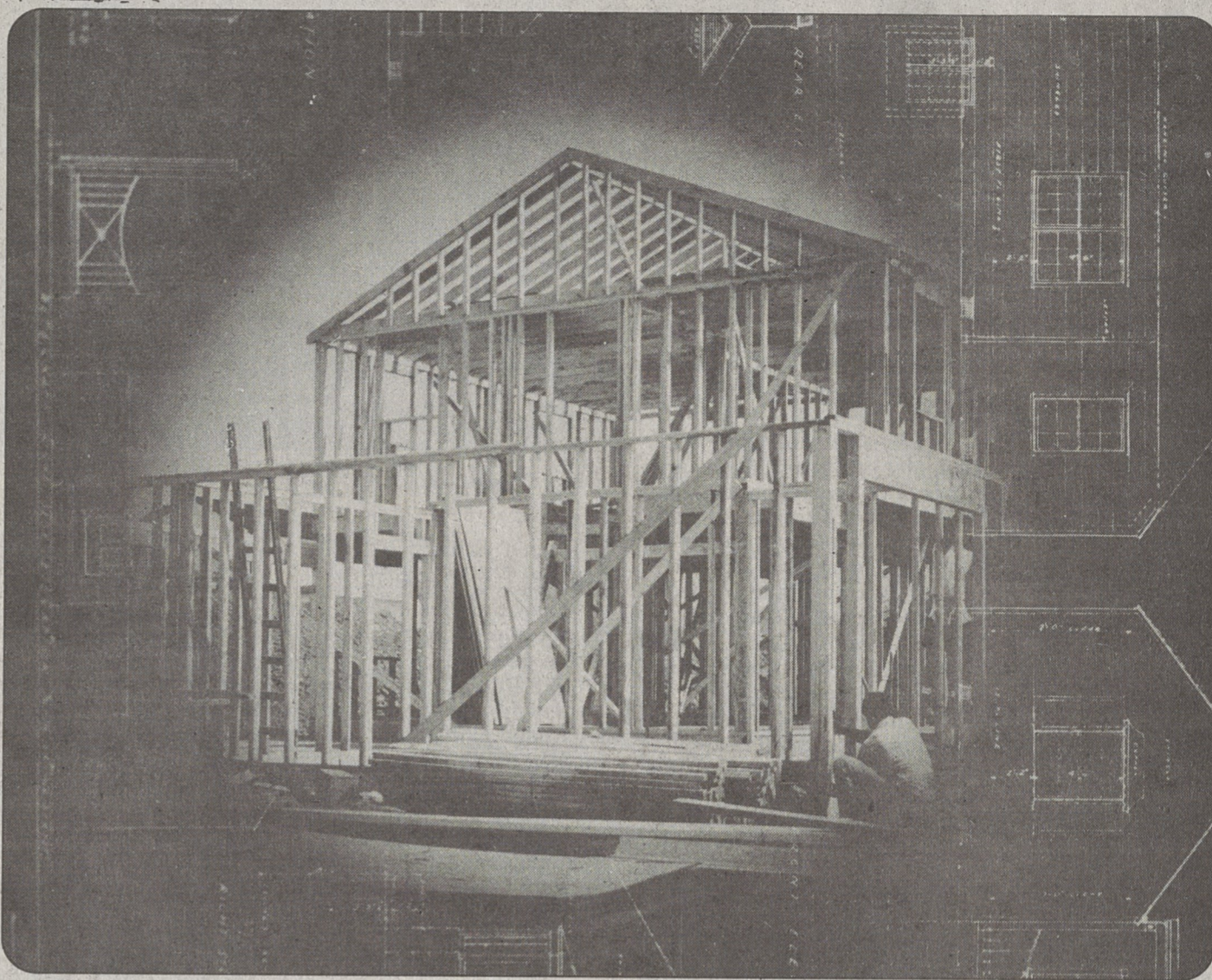
Dr. Grigg to speak at Oak Grove Baptist
