"I didn't plan to go back to work but when the nutrition site first opened at the Community Center I was called by Violet Dixon who managed the local Employment Security Commission and she twisted my arm," said Hicks.

We've made so many friends that working here at the Senior Center at the Depot is just like being home," she said.
