## **Election hearing** In D.C. Thursday

A hearing is scheduled by U. S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin in Washington, DC Thursday afternoon that could clear up the confusion on how Cleveland County will elect county commissioners.

Sporkin has been directed by an appeals court to instruct the county on how it will proceed with elections after a three judge federal appeals court ruled against Sporkin and the county, agreeing with the Cleveland County Association for Government of the People, which successfully sued the county for entering into an agreement with the NAACP that led to the appointment of Bobby Malloy and Mary Accor to the board of county commissioners.

The appeals court ruled that the county has no authority to change the makeup of the commission from a five to a sevenmember board.
