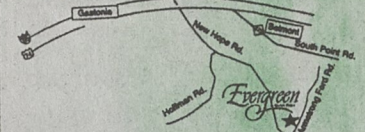

assault on a police officer. He was jailed under \$50,000 secured bond. Officer Benton said more charges are pending.

Officers confiscated 23.5 grams of methamphetamine, one pound of marijuana and assorted drug paraphernalia in the suspect's vehicle he was driving when he ran from a vehicle stop Monday morning.

The board awarded contracts to the low bidders, including Pinnix Inc., Gastonia, general construction, \$1,121,676; Yandle and Davies Plumbing of Charlotte, \$61,026; Shelby Heating and Air Conditioning, \$114,401; and Lake Electric of Denver, \$248,067. The total cost also includes \$36,125 for demolition by John E. Jenkins Inc. of Gastonia and architectural costs of \$110,730 plus reimbursable expenses per contract depending on change orders

at \$4,000. Last week council members asked the architects to have each of the winning bidders for the new station to review their construction plans for the new building to shave the costs. Maney said new features of the new building would include a command center where all communications would be centered along with back-up generators for emergencies.

Election hearing In D.C. Thursday

A hearing is scheduled by U. S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin in Washington, DC Thursday afternoon that could clear up the confusion on how Cleveland County will elect county commissioners.

Sporkin has been directed by an appeals court to instruct the county on how it will proceed with elections after a three judge federal appeals court ruled against Sporkin and the county, agreeing with the Cleveland County Association for Government of the People, which successfully sued the county for entering into an agreement with the NAACP that led to the appointment of Bobby Malloy and Mary Accor to the board of county commissioners.

The appeals court ruled that the county has no authority to change the makeup of the commission from a five to a seven-member board.

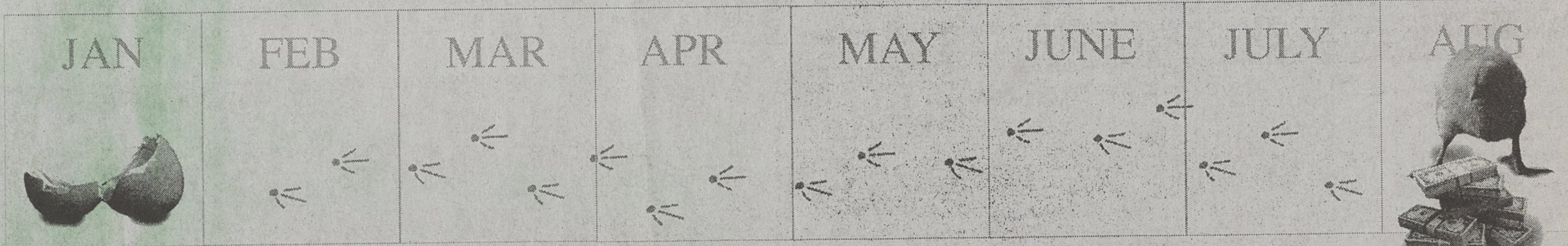
