Eagles here Friday for 5 p.m. scrimmage

After practicing against each other for two weeks, Kings Mountain's Mountaineers will get to see how they fare against another team Friday at 5 p.m. when they host Fayetteville Byrd in a scrimmage at John Gamble Stadium.

If this year's Byrd team is typical of past teams, it should be quite a test.

Coached by North Carolina prep coaching legend Bob Paroli, the Eagles are always in the hour for the state 4A championship-They've been in the

4A title game each of the last three seasons, falling last year to Richmond County and two years ago to Crest.

"We feel like Byrd will give us a good test as far as how we stack up physically, and also how we stack up against a team that has excellent speed. They have both of those characteristics," said KMHS Coach Ron Massey.

Paroli, who is North Carolina's winningest active high school football coach with 275 victories, has a host of players returning from last year's team. Byrd and Kings Mountain scrimmaged briefly in the Raleigh Pigskin Classic last August.

Shawn Davis, a senior with a lot of running and passing ability, returns to the quarterback position after playing free safety last year. At 6-1, 175, he is being recruited by several Division I schools.

Byrd is traditionally a power running team, and Paroli has his top runner back from a year ago, junior tailback C.J. Harcwick who gained 1,502 yards and scored 15 touchdowns.

Massey said the Mountaineers will use this scrimmage to look at some players they are trying at more than one position. He said he'll probably do the same Friday night, August 21 when the Mountaineers travel to Gaffney to compete against Gaffney and Dorman.

"We are trying to put some people in the right position, and we'll evaluate where some kids will help us the most," he said. "We got a little bit of a look at them Saturday night. We'll probably look at some kids at two positions up until our last scrimmage, and then decide where we're going to put them." Massey said the defensive line, where he lost three
