

Still's paintings to be unveiled

Florida artist Christopher Still, son of Dr. and Mrs. John Still of Kings Mountain, has been busy.

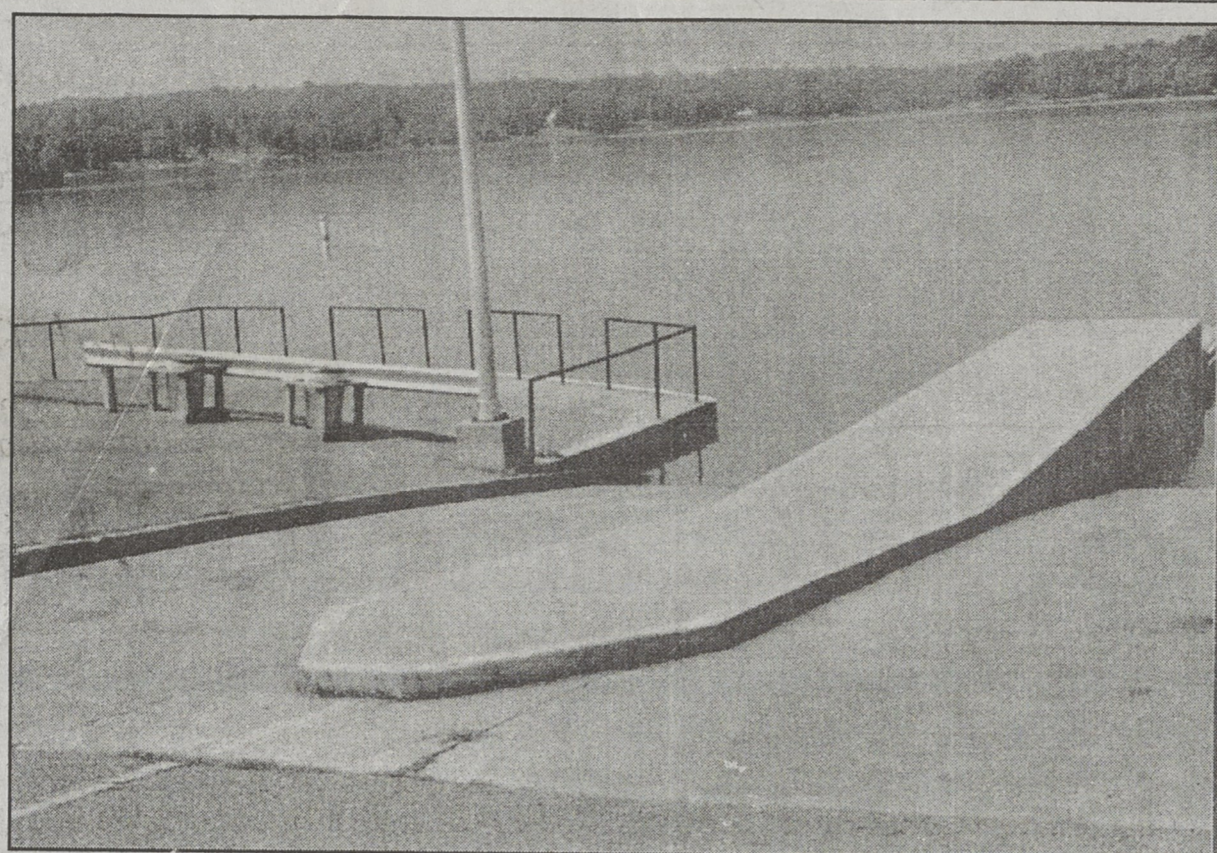
He was commissioned by the family of Florida Governor Lawton Chiles and the Florida Legislature to paint the official portrait of Chiles that will hang in Tallahassee with the portraits of all the state's other past governors. Chiles will unveil the portrait on December 3.

The City Council of St. Petersburg awarded Still \$50,000 to paint two 10 foot murals for the city hall and the murals will be unveiled also in December.

Still was featured in a recent feature page cover story by Jacquin Sanders in Times-Florida. The article was entitled, "Brushes of Greatness" and included color pictures of Christopher Still's private collection "Changing Tides" and a picture of Still painting Stevey, a pelican which recovered from severe injuries caused by a wrathful fisherman but remains blind.

Both pictures that will hang in the city hall show boats, fishermen, families and scenes from life.

"I wanted to paint Florida," he says. "That's one good reason I'm an artist."

Justice Department okays election

Filing for five seats up for grabs on the county board of commissioners begins at noon

Monday, August 31, and ends at noon Monday, September 14. The U. S. Justice Department Wednesday morning gave approval of the election schedule.

The primary for commissioners is November 3. A second primary, if needed, will be held December 1. The general election for county commissioners is January 12, 1999.

Under an order signed by U. S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin both parties will hold primaries November 3.

The Democrats held a primary in May because six candidates filed to run. If they all refile, they will be joined by incumbent Willie McIntosh, who must also stand for reelection under Sporkin's order.

The Republicans did not have a primary in May because only five candidates filed to run. All candidates must refile.

Sporkin ruled recently during a hearing in Washington, DC that the two candidates receiv-

ing the most votes in the general election would serve four year terms, the next three would receive two year terms and thereafter everyone would serve four years to return to the stagger that would have been in effect if a consent decree had never been entered into by the county and the NAACP.

Sporkin ordered that details of an election schedule be worked out and submitted to him by Cleveland County, the Cleveland County Association for Government by the People and the NAACP.

The county entered into an agreement with the NAACP that expanded the county board of commissioners from five to seven members and appointed two minority members. CCAGP sued and a federal appeals court ruled in their favor, saying the commission did not have the authority to change its makeup.

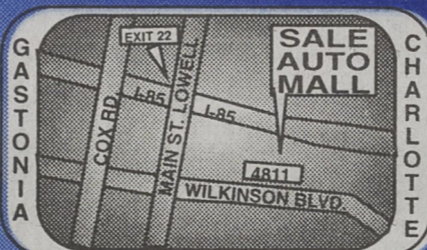
