The Mountaineers will be counting on a young-but-talented defense to keep the Warriors off the war path. All-Conference senior tackle Frank Hopper (6-3, 299) leads the way up front and Julius Curry (6-0, 256 senior), a pre-season All-State pick on offense, will play a lot at nose guard, making it tough for the opponents to run the ball inside.

Returning senior starter KeLee Thompson anchors the defense at linebacker, and fourvear starter Landon Benton at defensive back will try to keep the Warriors from being successful in the air.

Offensively, Kings Mountain will try to counter with a balanced running and passing game led by a host of returning starters off last year's team which shared the Southwestern 3A Conference championship and made it to the Western State finals.

Senior Anthony Ash, who passed for over 1,000 yards and also developed into a top option running threat late in the regular season and in the playoff run, will return at quarterback and 1,400-yard rusher Anthony Hillman, a 202-pound junior, appears set for a banner season at fullback.

Another key offensive weapon will be senior receiver Kendrick Bell, who caught 24 passes for 385 yards last year and over his two-year varsity career has caught 50 for 792 yards. His talent may also be showcased some on defense this year to take advantage of his speed and athletic ability.

What may be most impressive about Kings Mountain's offense, though, is its mammoth line which averages over 250 pounds per man and includes several players who weigh 300 or better. Guards Julius Curry and Mariko Feemster (6-5, 320) and tackle Kareem Marshall (6-6, 365) are being heavily recruited by Division 1 schools, and senior center Andy Leigh (6-2, 245) is being recruited by some Division 1-AA schools.
