"They've probably blocked six kicks in the three games that I've seen," said Massey. "They rush the punter and cause a lot of safeties from the punter not being able to handle the ball. That's a big concern of ours.'

So, what will be Mountaineers have to do to counter that exceptional talent?

"We're going to have to play with a lot of emotion," Massey said. "We're going to have to make

some big plays ad try to limit them from making them.'

Another big key, he said, will be how the Mountaineers execute their special teams. Last week, that

"We've got to make some positive yardage on first and second down," he said. "We can't let them put us in a third and long situation. They thrive on that."

Concentration and execution will be a big key if the Mountaineers are to win.

"It's going to be a tough ball game," Massey said. "If we can keep it close going into the fourth quarter we'll have an opportunity to win. If we let them jump out like they did last year and we have to play catch-up it will be tough. They have some kids going both ways. If we can get in the fourth quarter and be in striking distance I'll fell pretty good about it."

To City Council on October 27, 1998 Additional Beer And Wine Sales on SUNDAY

My Position:

1. No Additional Beer and Wine sales on Sunday in Kings Mountain.

2. Demand that the Alcohol Law Enforcement (ALE) Agency audit the present four or five establishments operating under the so-called "Restaurant Loophole Provision" to verify their compliance with the law. If they are not in compliance, then revoke their licenses to sell on Sunday.
