2 tablespoons onion, minced 1/8 teaspoon red pepper

2 tablespoon sesame seeds

1 tablespoon sugar

3/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon instant minced

garlic 2 chickens

Combine above ingredients except chicken. Cut chickens in quarters or pieces and pour mixture over chicken and marinate for 12 hours. Cook chicken on grill until done.
