# Mountaineers blank Bessemer 44-0

Kings Mountain's Mountaineers scored on five of their six first half possessions and rolled to a 44-0 victory over Bessemer City Friday, September 4 in Bessemer City.

The Mountaineers drove 90 yards on their first possession with junior fullback Anthony Hillman gaining 75 yards in just five carries, and Joe Williamson capping it off with a 10-yard touchdown catch from quarterback Anthony Ash for a 6-0 lead.

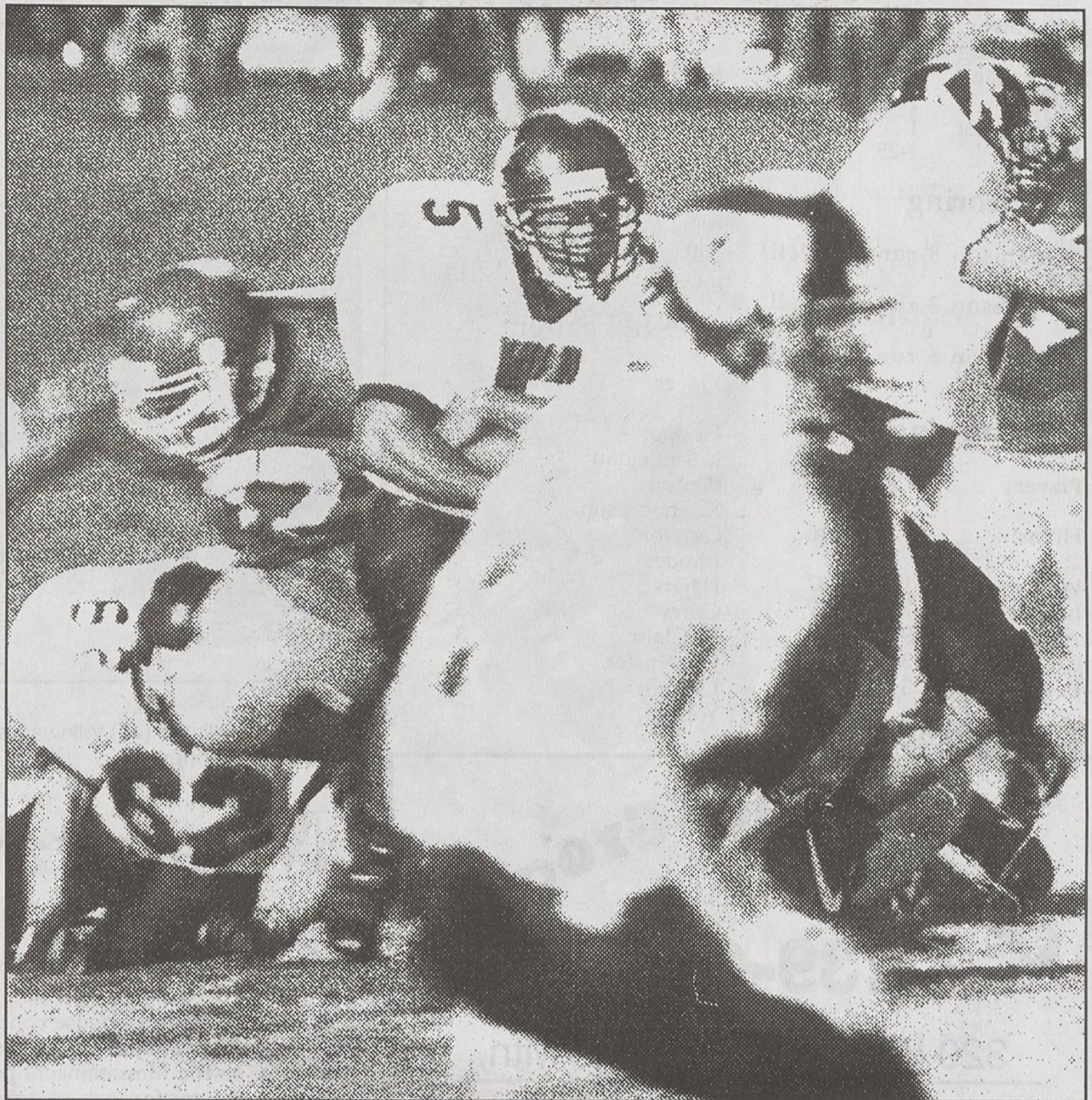
The next time the Mountaineers got the ball - on the BC 29 yard line - it took just one play to score with Hillman going all the way to put the Mountaineers up 13-0.

"Jumping out to a quick lead helped us," said KM Coach Ron Massey. "I thought our effort was good and I thought the defense did a great job as far as not allowing them to get anything going."

The rout allowed Massey to play a lot of different players, including 11 junior varsity player that were called up for the game because the JV team had an open date.

"I thought everybody gave a great effort," Massey said. "We had a couple of breakdowns execution-wise. In a couple of series we got a little sloppy, but overall I think both sides played well."

The Mountaineers finished with 310 yards rushing, led by Hillman with 144 yards in eight carries. After his first period TD run of 29 yards, he sat out the remainder of the first half. He returned at the start of the second half, touching the ball just twice more in a two-play, 40-yard scoring drive which result-

ed in a touchdown from 24 yards out which gave the Mounties a 37-0 lead with 11:08 left in the third quarter. Back-up fullbacks Antonio Goodlet and Rocky Ingram combined for 99 yards rushing in 12 carries, and each scored a touchdown.
