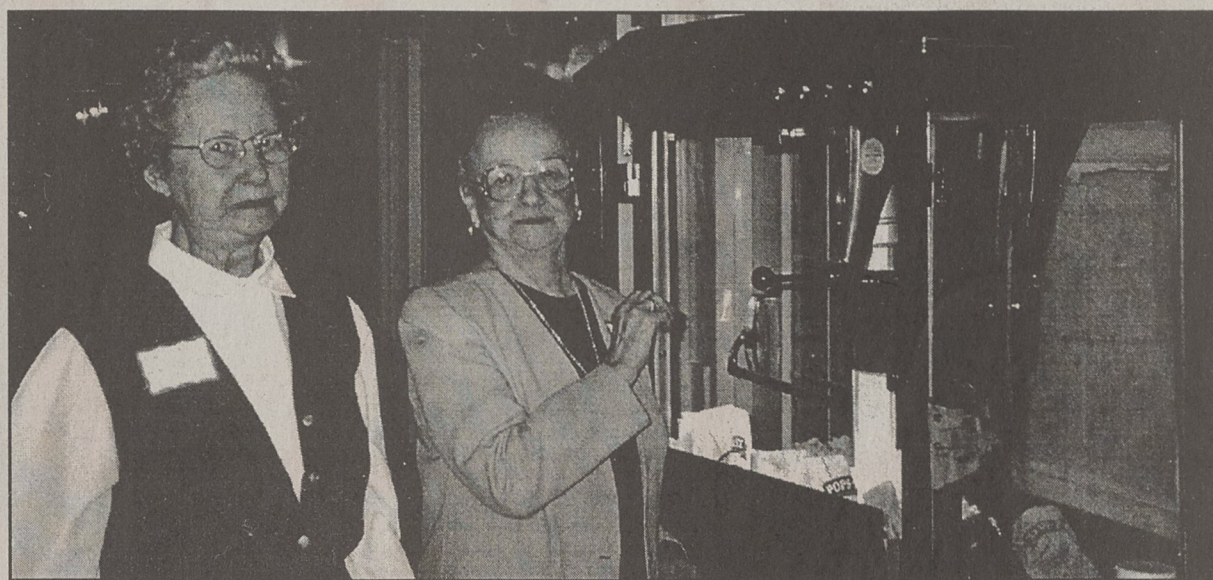


EdenGardens celebrates assisted living

The weather may have been dreary when EdenGardens of Kings Mountain had their Assisted Living Day last Saturday, but inside the senior citizen's facility all was cheery and bright. Showcasing the assisted living concept in caring for elders, EdenGardens hosted resident's family members, friends, and dignitaries for the event which featured refreshments, decorations, and old-time hospitality.

"We wanted to celebrate assisted living," said EdenGardens marketing director Denise Leonard.

One of the special guests at EdenGardens was Jerry L. Cooper, Executive Director of the North Carolina Assisted Living Association. Cooper's organization represents 8,000 beds in assisted living facilities across the state.

"When a person enters an assisted living center, we want them to feel as if the only thing that has changed about their life is the address," Cooper said. "We want assisted living facilities to be integrated into the community and allow residents to continue their relationships with churches, garden clubs, friends, and relatives. Assisted living is really supported housing for senior citizens who need

a supervised living environment."

For residents who have Alzheimer's and other cognitive

difficulties, EdenGardens has their "Keepsake" program. Housed in a secure environment with a 24 hour, 7 day a week staff, "Keepsake" provides residents with activities and surrounding that retain to the highest possible degree a sense of family and familiarity. A special feature of the "Keepsake" program is an outdoor garden

area where residents can walk or simply enjoy the sun.

"One of the most important differences between assisted living and other types of senior citizen care is the social and residential approach we take as opposed to an institutional feel," Cooper commented.

Another misconception about assisted living is that it is only for the wealthy.

"Thirty five percent of people seeking assisted living are qualified for Medicaid and state or

county assistance," Cooper said. "We are working hard to make assisted living available for all income levels."

As a popcorn machine filled the lobby of EdenGardens with its heavenly aroma, and friends chatted in front of a crackling fire, all seemed like home.

"The people here are just like family," said EdenGardens resident and Kings Mountain native Mae Sue McGillis. "I worked at the Margrace mill for many years and it's that same type of family feeling."

The defendant is all present and future interest in the above-captioned property.

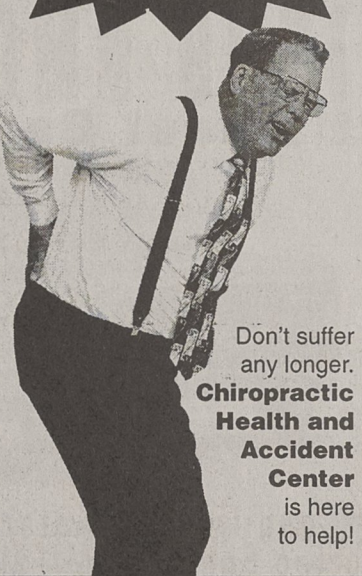
A warrant for the arrest of the defendant property has been duly issued and executed by the United States Marshal.

Any person who claims to have rights or interest in, or claims against, the defendant property, in order to protect such interest from forfeiture by default, must file a verified claim within ten (10) days after the publication of this Public Notice, or within ten (10) days of actual notice or of individual service of notice of this action. All claims must be verified on oath or solemn affirmation, state the interest in the property by virtue of which the claimant demands its restitution and the right to defend this action, and be in full compliance with Rule C(6) of the Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims, Title 28, United States Code Appendix. Claimants must file answers to the complaint within twenty (20) days after the filing of the claim.

All claims and answers must be filed with United States District Court for the Western District of North Carolina at the address below. Claimants have the burden proof on all issues pursuant to 19 U.S.C. § 1615. Additional procedures regarding this action may be found at 19 U.S.C. §§1602-1621. In addition to or in lieu of filing a claim, any person may assert an interest in defendant property by submitting a Petition for Remission or Mitigation of forfeiture pursuant to 28 C.F.R. Part 9.
