

WILDA TROUT 2 handfuls macaroni 4 hard-boiled eggs 1/2 small can English peas 4 slices diced cheese 2 stalks celery 1 small onion 1 small bell pepper

1 raw carrot 2 tbsp. mayonnaise 1 tsp. sugar salt to taste

To cooked macaroni, add all ingredients, draining the English peas before hand. Mix well with mayonnaise. Refrigerate and let stand for a couple of hours. This makes a large casserole, around 2 quarts, of salad.
