Acuff successfully completed 12 weeks of training designed to challenge new Marine recruits both physically and men-

Acuff and fellow recruits begin their training at 5 am, by running three miles and performing calisthentics. In addition to the physical conditioning program, Acuff spent numerous hours in classroom and field assignments which included learning first aid, uniform regulations, combat water survival, marksmanship, handto-hand combat, and assorted weapons training. They performed close-order drill and operated as a small infantry unit during field training.

Acuff and other recruits also received instruction on the Maine Corps' core values-- honor, courage and committment, and what the words mean in guiding personal and professional conduct.

Acuff and fellow recruits ended the training phase with The Crucible, a 54-hour team effort, problem solving evolution which culminated with an emotional ceremony in which the recruits were presented the Marine Corps Emblem, and were addressed as "Marines" for the first time since boot camp

Acuff joins 41,000 men and women who will enter the Marine Corps this year from all over the country.
