In the fall of 1984 the troop was again reorganized with Jim Ferebee serving as Scoutmaster, and he served until 1996 when present Scoutmaster Ed Ormsby took over.

At least 20 Scouts have earned their Eagle Scout Award through Troop 92, and it is estimated that three to four hundred have participated in the

The membership has varied over the years, with as many as 45 members at one time, and since 1984 Troop 92 has been one of the larger and stronger troops in the Battleground District. The troop has not had less than 20 active members during that time. Troop 92 was District Troop of the Year in
