Summer offers numerous opportunities in and around Cleveland County

There are recreational and educational activities galore for folks in and around Kings Mountain to do this summer. No matter if your taste in recreation runs from climbing mountains to just quietly listening to some good old time music, Cleveland County and it environs has something for every-

The Broad River Greenway just outside of Boiling Springs on Highway 150 is one of Cleveland County's outdoor treasures. Spread along the banks of the First Broad River, the Greenway is a hiking, canoeing, and naturalist paradise. From April until October, something is going on nearly every weekend at the Broad River Greenway.

The month of June features a variety of activities at Broad River Greenway. Saturday, June 19th at 10 am, Piedmont naturalist Bill Hilton, Jr., director of Education and Research at Stowe Botanical Gardens, will present a program on the joy of birds and birding. The next day, Sunday, June 20th, a lecture on bugs and spiders will be hosted by Dr. Barbara Burkett of Gardner-Webb University. Both birders and bug hunters should meet at the restored log cabin on the Greenway.

June 27th will see one of the most unusual demonstrations of the year take place at the Broad River Greenway. Catfish had better beware when father and son team Allen and Lyman Jones hold an exhibition of grabbling. Now, for those unfamiliar with grabbling, the idea is to wade into the river, feel around logs and rocks for a fish, and then haul that rascal out. Those who care to join the Jones family in this action packed sport are advised to bring old clothes and shoes.

Broad River Greenway programs for July will begin on the 10th with an archaeology class conducted by Dr. Allen May of the Schiele Museum. July 11th will see a woodcarving exhibition at the Greenway by expert carver Frank Barrow. Folks curious about local snakes can see several up close but safe when Dr. Joseph Talley hosts an exhibit at the cabin on July 17. The history of Cleveland County will be the subject of a talk at 2 pm on July 25 by Lamar Wilson,

director of the Cleveland County Historical Museum. Rounding out the month of July, the 31st will see the Carolina Raptor Center bring an exhibit of their work rehabilitating injured birds of prey.

As summer draws to a close in August, plenty of action will still be taking place at Broad River Greenway. Crowders Mountain State Park has a lot of action on tap during the month of June. Saturday, June 19th will see a night hike and owl outing take place beginning at 8:30 pm. The walk and presentation will take about an hour. Participants should meet at the park office and wear sturdy shoes.

Anyone with a desire to get to know bats better can do just that at 8:30 pm on Sunday, June 20th at Crowders Mountain State Park. Meet at the lake

parking lot for this informative and interesting trip. The next week, June 26th, visitors to Crowders Mountain State Park can take a hike looking for reptiles and amphibians. The walk will last about an hour. June programs will come to a close at the park on the 27th when parents and children are invited to explore a creek with rangers. The 2 pm adventure will last for just over one hour and participants are advised to wear clothes they won't mind getting


