The meeting is open to the public.

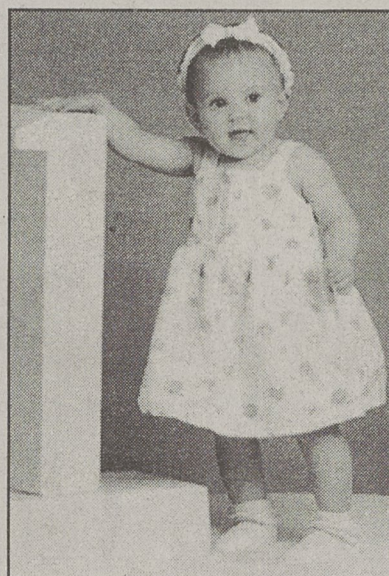
## BIRTHDAYS

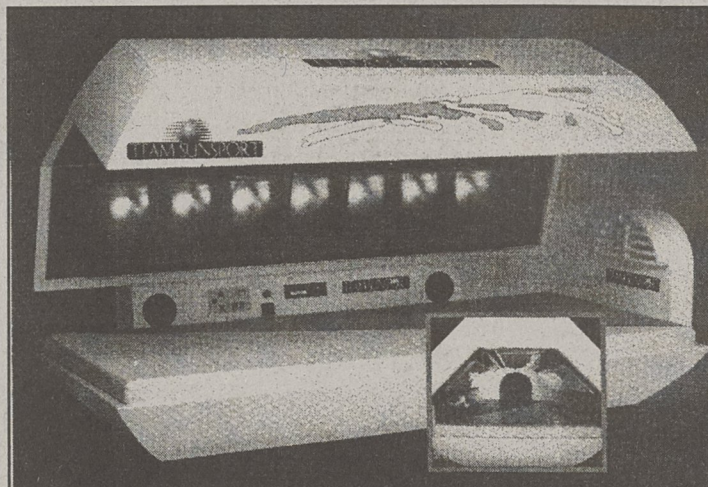
