# Grassy Smith memorial to attract best field in local history

It's only fitting that the biggest dirt track race in local history will be in honor of racing's most influential

The late Clarence "Grassy" Smith will be honored Thursday night (July 15) with a memorial race at Thunder Valley Speedway in Lawndale. Grassy Smith passed away last January after a bout with cancer. He was

Track promoter Ernie Elkins is expecting up to 45 of the nation's top super late model drivers for the 60-lap main event. The winner will take home \$5,000.

"This is all in honor of Grassy," Elkins said. "He is one of the pioneers in racing, not just dirt track, but all of racing. The bulk of engine builders in

NASCAR Winston Cup today worked with or for Grassy including Robert Yates, Keith Dorton and Waddell Wilson."

Headlining the field will be Grassy's son Freddy Smith, who is the defending and only fivetime world dirt track champion. Freddy's son Jeff Smith is also entered in the field along with Hav-A-Tampa points leader Dale McDowell, Ray Cook, C.S. Fitzgerald, Ronnie Johnson, Randall Chupp, Mike Duvall, Ricky Weeks, Jack Pennington, Ray Tucker, Phil Hall, Petey Ivey, Dennis Franklin, Clint Elkins, Randy Morrison, Dale Lineberger, Doug Sanders, Dan Brewer, Larry Blankenship, Steve Hendren and Wendell Wallace.

The main event will be a Southern All Stars race. Gates open at 4 p.m., with hot laps scheduled for 7:15 and racing at set for 8. All super late models will run time trials to set the running order for heat races.

'We're expecting a good crowd," said Elkins. "I would like to see the place fill up. Grassy's family are all from Kings Mountain, and I would like to see all of Cleveland County come out and support one of it's big names."

Although Grassy never drove a race car, he built championship engines for more than 50 years. He was a part of NASCAR's early history as an engine builder for Holman-Moody in Charlotte where he worked on motors for drivers such as Cale Yarborough, David Pearson and Bobby Allison.

When Freddy Smith started racing go-carts in the early 1960s, Grassy left the NASCAR garages behind and started his own business in Kings Mountain, Smith and Sons Automotive.

"There wasn't anything about racing he didn't know," Freddy said. "When I turned 18, he started helping me with

stock cars. It's hard to say how many cars he went on to build. It had to be well into the hundreds.

"I give him all the credit for my success," Freddy said. "I've won 770 races in my career and he was involved in 90 percent of them."

Grassy fielded several champion late model dirt track cars during the 1980s and '90s. He continued to build engines until a few seasons ago.

"The last motor he built was season before last," Freddy Smith said. "We put the motor in a car and sold it to a driver from Georgia named Bruce Taylor. His first time out, he set the fastest qualifying time. And his second race, he won. It tickled Dad to death. I think Taylor went on to win five or six races that season."

Belmont's Doug Sanders was another one of Grassy Smith's success stories. Sanders drove for Grassy in the early 1990s when he won a Shrine 100 at Carolina Speedway.


