No response at hearing on 4-year term

The public was mum Tuesday night during a public hearing by City Council on resolution of intent to amend the city charter and call for a vote at the polls in November on changing the terms of office to four years for the mayor and city council.

The vote by council will come at a special meeting August 4 at 6:30 p.m. at city hall.

Mayor Scott Neisler, who is not running for reelection, is a strong proponent of reinstating the four year term because of what he sees as a need for "continuity."

"Every seat is up again this year in November and a city our size with a \$20 million budget deserves experienced leadership," said Neisler who was the only member of council to speak

"If the General Assembly would allow it I would support a two year staggered term because terms need to be staggered to add stability to the board," he said.

He said the change from four year to two year term was approved by a small turnout of citizens. Now is the time for citizens to speak out, he said, since the referendum could be held at the same time as the municipal election.

The U.S. Justice Department must approve the special referendum.
