# NC SKI REPORT

Recent cold weather in the North Carolina mountains is bringing a bonanza to area ski resorts. That, and all the new ski equipment Santa brought from the slopes indicate plenty of manmade snow with more to come. The following updates are from the resorts as of December 29.

Appalachian Ski Mountain reports 50-62 inches of average base snow with new machine made snow. Seven slopes are open at Appalachian and primary surface conditions are packed powder. Night skiing and snow boarding are also being offered. Call 828-295-7828 for more information.

Cataloochee has a 32-44 average base of manmade snow with four slopes open. The primary surface conditions are machine groomed. Night skiing is available as well as snow boarding. Call 828-926-0285.

Sapphire Valley reports 12-36 inches of average base snow with new machine snow added. Two slopes of machine groomed skiing, tubing, snow boarding, and night skiing are available. The phone at Sapphire Valley is 828-743-1163.

The December 29 report from the Southeastern Ski Areas Association didn't contain in-

formation on Scaly Mountain, but Scaly's number is 1-800-929-SNOW.

Ski Beech reports 15-30 inches of snow with a trace of new natural snow and the rest man-made. Ten slopes are open at Ski Beech and are offering packed powder conditions for their day and evening skiing as well as snow boarding and tubing. Call Ski Beech at 828-387-2011.

Hawksnest has three inches of natural snow on its 29-67 inch base and is making man-made snow as well. Seven slopes are open with packed powder for day and night skiing as well as snow boarding. The number at Hawksnest is 828-963-6561.

Sugar Mountain's 13 slopes have an average snow base of 12-52 inches with new machine made snow. Packed powder is on tap for skiing, snow boarding, and tubing. Give Sugar Mountain a call at 1-800-SUG-ARMT.

Rounding out the North Carolina ski scene is Wolf Laurel at 828-689-4111. Wolf Laurel has a 22-32 inch base with new machine made snow being added. The four slopes open at Wolf Laurel have machine groomed slopes for skiing, snow boarding, and tubing.
