schools. While the number has not reached epidemic proportions, I do believe the increase should be cause for concern. I am asking our school personnel to be

especially attentive to student behavior for the remainder of the school year and to respond quickly to misbehaviors which occur. Our system will continue its very strong stance in regards to any occurrences which involve drugs or firearms.

First of all, let me remind you of our penalties for these violations. In the case of firearms we follow state law and actually exceed it in part. State law requires a 365 day suspension for any student who brings a firearm or explosive device on school property. That is, of

course, the rule in this system. A student who is not responsible for bringing the item on school property but who handles it in any way is in for a suspension for the remainder of the school year, a penalty not required by state law.

For involvement with drugs, penalties are also quite serious. Mere possession and/or use of drugs at school results in a 10day suspension on the first offense. This suspension can be reduced to three days if the student and parents agree to complete a drug education course. If the student so agrees but does not complete the course, the remainder of the 10-day suspension is invoked. A second drug offense at any time during the student's enrollment results in a long term suspension for the remainder of the school year.

We have an even more serious penalty if the student involved is distributing the drug to someone else either by selling it or giving it away. İn such circumstances the student is long term suspended for the remainder of the year without opportunity to reduce the suspension. It has been our philosophy that in these cases a stronger measure of discipline is appropriate as the behavior of the student in question is affecting someone in addition to himself/herself.

Why we are seeing this increase in incidents at this time is not something for which I have an answer. We have had these strong disciplinary consequences in place for such offenses for some time. Students involved have been quickly and consistently disciplined. We have numerous drug and weapons awareness programs in the system. For some reason we have seen a recent increase in the number of students who either (1) don't care about the rules; (2) think they can participate without getting caught; or (3) can't walk away from others

Obviously, our entire community needs to help with this problem. We will continue our efforts. We also need the help of our families in monitoring the behavior of their students. These drugs and firearms come to school from off the school grounds. These students have been able to obtain them somewhere. Parents must be careful to keep abreast of the places their children go and the people with whom they associate. None of these efforts will guarantee that such problems can't occur, but they will certainly help minimize the opportunity. Parents should also talk with their children about the dangers of involvement with firearms and drugs.

who want to drag them down.

We believe our children must be held accountable for these behaviors. We also believe that very strong measures of discipline are appropriate for the very troubling occurrences

which are the topic of this column. All that being said, our last desire is to apply such serious consequences to students. We would much prefer that we do not have to do so. What that takes is a more serious understanding by students of what their responsibilities are while at school and school-related events. I can assure you that we would like nothing better than to have a year when no such events take place. I believe this

We cannot let our discourage-

ment at these recent events allow us to lose our focus. Our strategies are sound, and we must continue them. We know many more of out students refrain from these activities than take part in them. In fact students often alert us to situations about which we should be attentive. We simply must continue the fight to rid our campuses of these problems. Hopefully, our community will join that fight with a more aggressive posture than ever before. We need you on our team.
