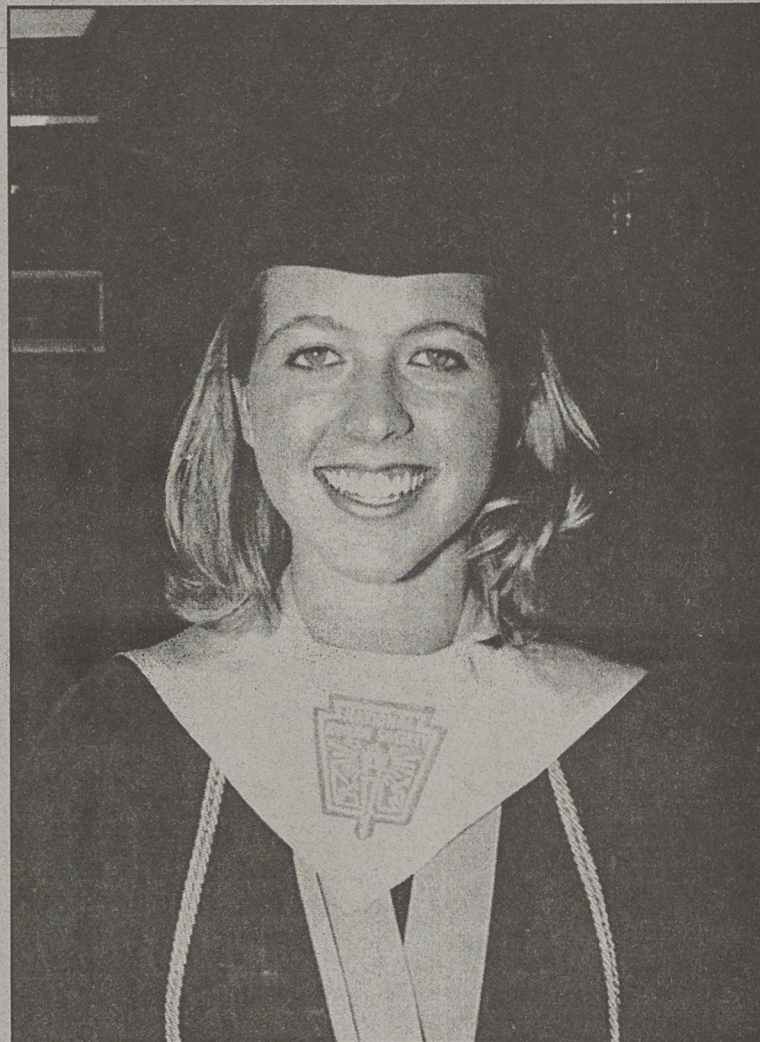


Senior Survey

The Herald caught nervous and excited Kings Mountain High graduating seniors getting ready for Friday night's commencement exercises and asked them a number of questions.

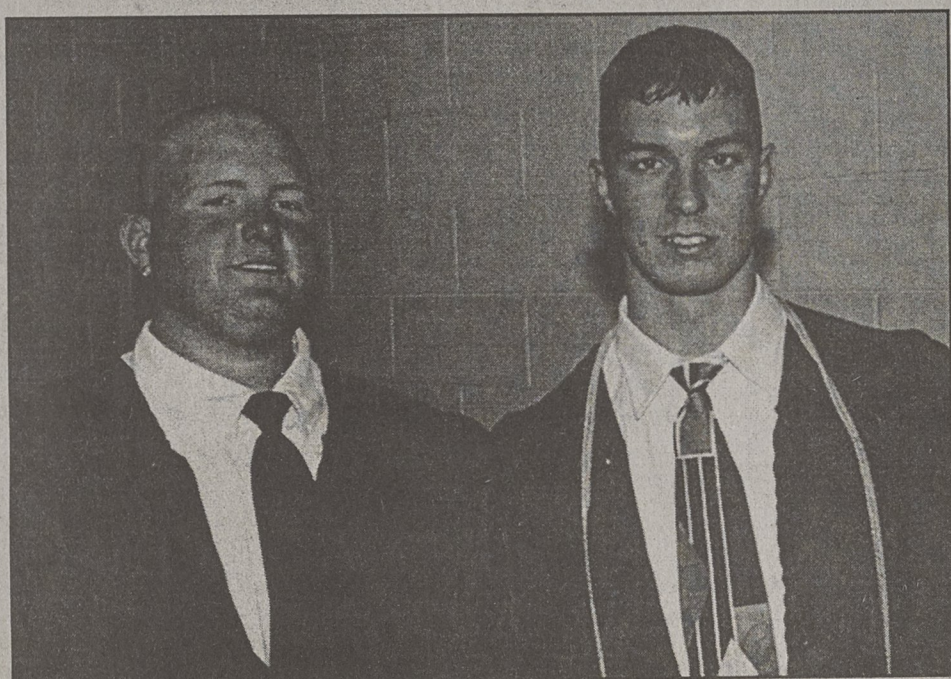

A - "My best friend, Anna George. We've been friends for as far back as I can remember."

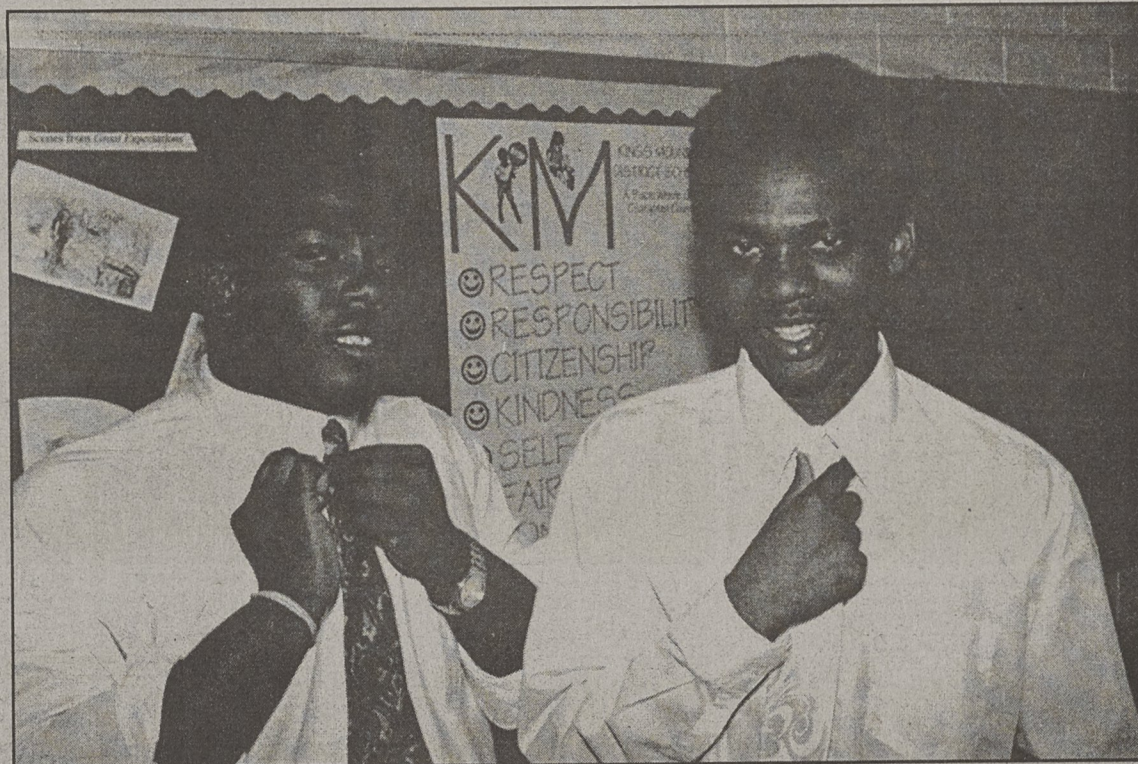
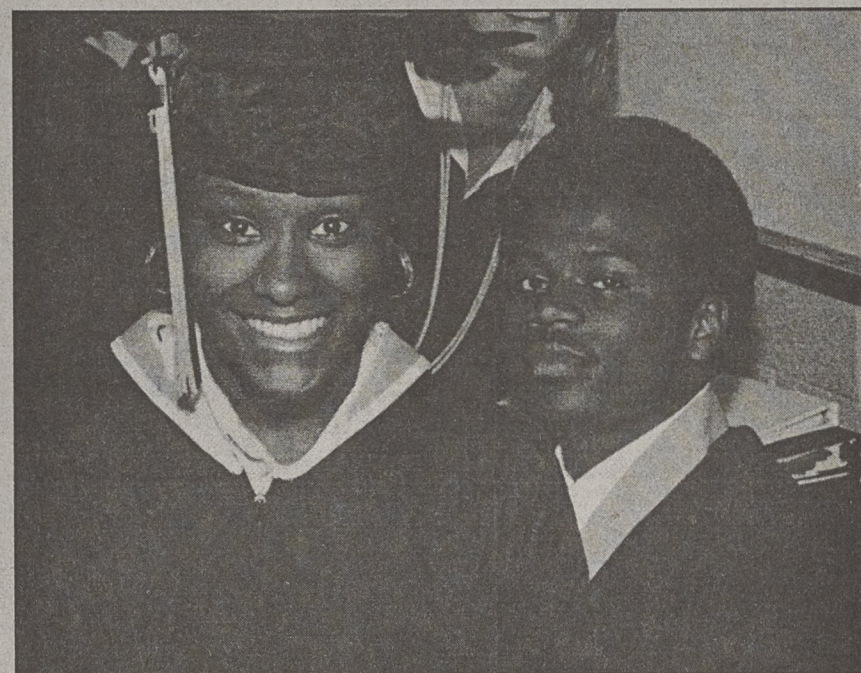


KEISHA JORDAN, BRIAN HOUZE

Brian Houze - "To go to Johnson C. Smith University and study pre-med and become an optometrist."

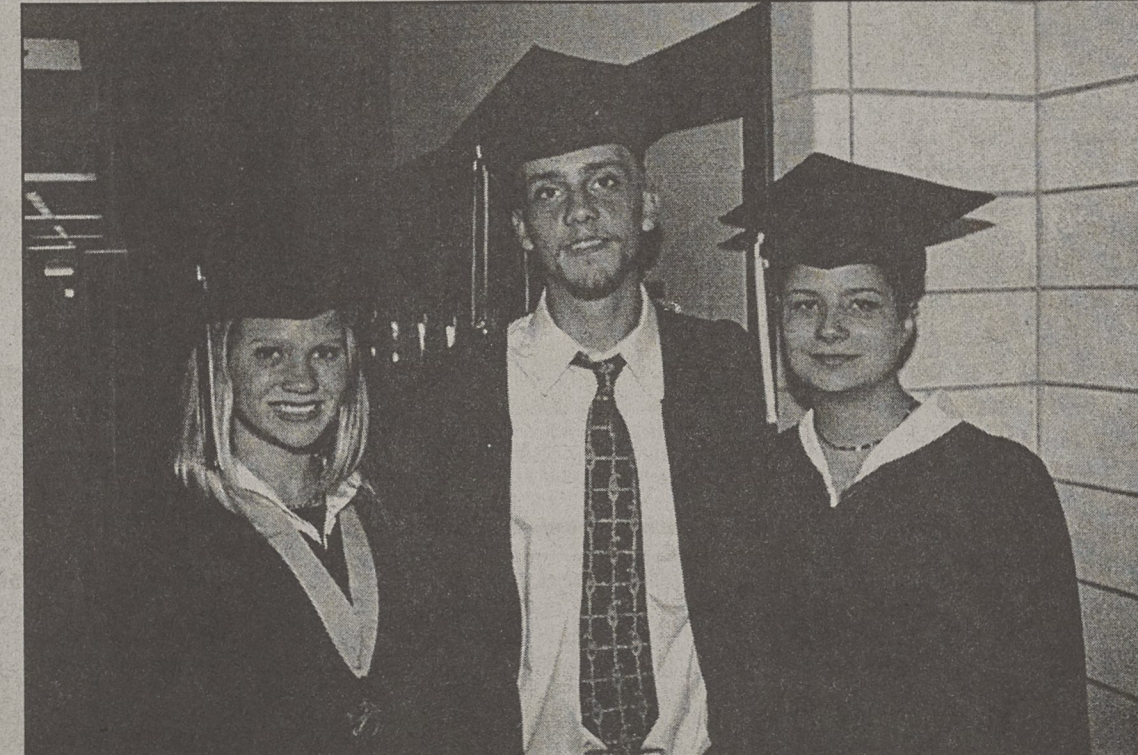


JASON FEEMSTER, left, and DANIEL DAVIS

Gerald Smith - "Getting to play football my senior year after being hurt my sophomore year."

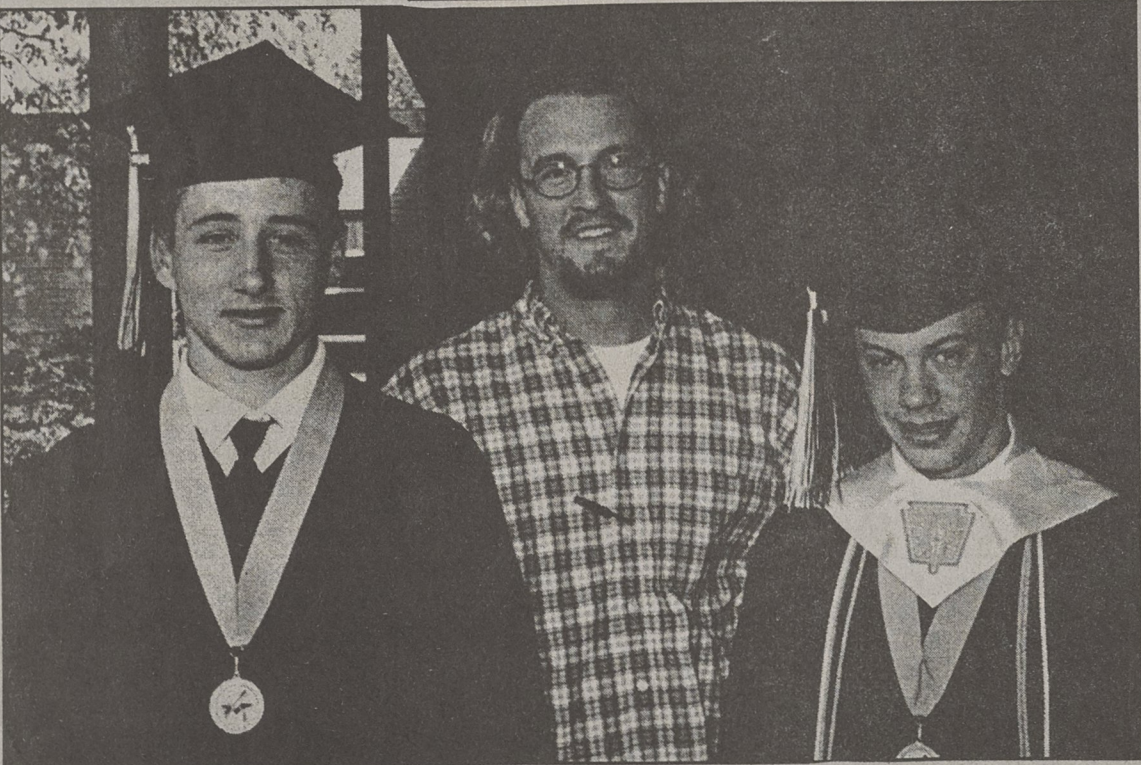
Jeremy Harris - "Playing in the state championship football game in Chapel Hill my junior year."
