The Kings Mountain High Booster Club recently elected officers for the 2000-01 athletic year.

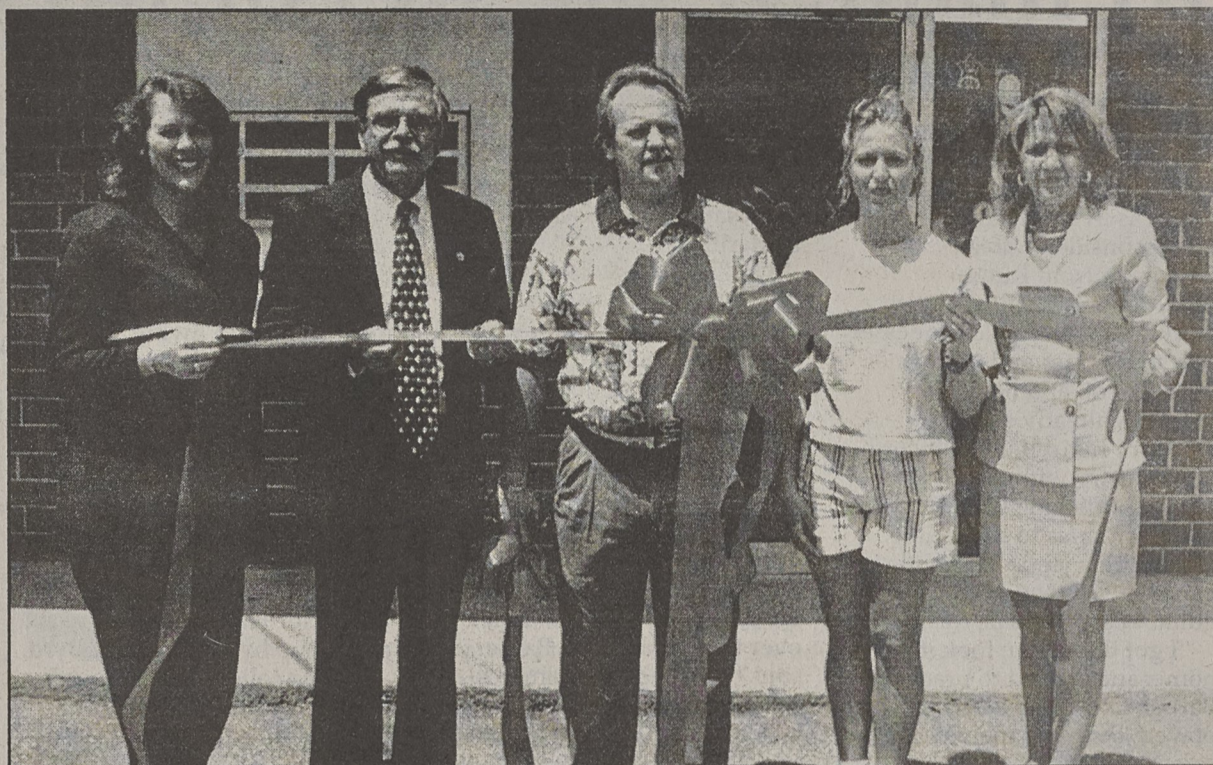
