KM rabies case County's 38th

A dead raccoon found at 113 Chestnut Ridge Road, Kings Mountain, on May 27 has tested positive for rabies.

According to County Health Director Denese R. Stallings, two dogs were observed around the raccoon and were possibly exposed. One dog had a current vaccination and was returned to its owner. Animal Control picked up the other dog with an expired rabies vaccination.

The State Laboratory in Raleigh confirmed the raccoon had rabies. This marks Cleveland County's 38th case of rabies since June 1998.

Stallings said residents need to make sure their animals are under their direct control.

Animals that are allowed to run loose are at risk of coming into contact with a rabid animal, and if the pet is not vaccinated it will have to be euthanized.

During the next six months, anyone living in the vicinity of 113 Chestnut Ridge Road should observe their animals for unusual behavior. In addition, residents need to make sure that all cats and dogs have a current rabies vaccination.

Anyone observing an animal demonstrating unusual behavior should call the Cleveland County Animal Control Department at 481-9884.
