umentation to the agency. Although things have been relatively quiet lately, the fight is far from over. Save Our Schools has already paid several thousand dollars in legal fees, but continuing community support is necessary to carry on the battle.

Childers is a member of Mount Whitaker Baptist Church in Blacksburg. She gave her testimony as the reigning Jr. Miss N.C. Global America at Blacksburg's recent Fourth of July celebration. She plans to attend the "Walk of Life" event to be held in Columbia on October 15 for breast cancer awareness. She is the daughter of Wynn and Della Childers of Grover and granddaughter of Joe and the late Reba Fortenberry of Grover and Richard and Peggy Yarborough of Kings Mountain.

prostate cancer.

"A girl from the American Cancer Society came to City Hall to meet with some of the key people from the city about beginning a Relay for Life here," he recalled. "It just so happened that it was on the very day that my father had his first treatment. Fire Chief Frank Burns volunteered me to be the chairman."

Neely and others also pointed out that they were greatly inspired by Joe Smith, a civic and business leader who lost a courageous fight against cancer earlier this year.

"Joe fought cancer very bravely and very dignified," Neely said. "He lost his battle to cancer but he will live in our hearts forever.

"Cancer affects us all," he added. "It knows no boundaries. But someday we're going to look back at cancer like we do polio. It's going to be a thing of the past.'

Joni Smith-Wilson, Joe Smith's daughter, also spoke of her father's courageous battle and urged everyone in atten-

dance to keep the fight going. "It's wonderful to have a Joe Smith Relay," she said, "because, in a way, he was every man. He enjoyed being just Joe. And it's the Joe Smiths and the Browns and the Joneses that fight every day to find a cure for this disease. It's everyone's battle. It's something he fought for until the day he died."

Smith-Wilson recalled that her father always spoke to his children about "do wells,"

things that everyone can and should do.

"He'd always say 'you'd do well to do this," " she noted. "But he always told us you have to pick your battles. You want to fix every problem, but you can't pick every battle and win. You have to pick your bat-tle and then fight it with all. you've got.

"There's a cure for cancer already out there," she added AA YE "We're not raising money to the find a cure but so the cure can come to us - so that all the pow-

ers that be can give it to us, grayeM
"We can beat this disease, Allriad we need is money. Daddy wantig ti ed to be able to beat this in his val lifetime. But he would be happy to know that all of his friends are working to beat cancer in 19169 the lifetime of his children and grandchildren."

'Some of the younger people will see it," added Neely. "People my age may not see, it, ie but it's on its way."
