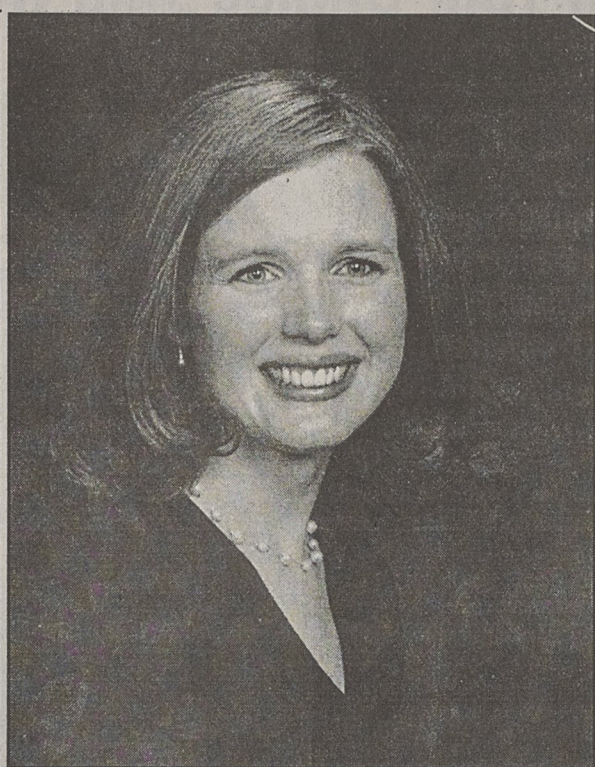
The bride's parents hosted the wedding reception at the church. The groom's parents hosted the rehearsal dinner at Carolina Country Barbecue.

COOKING

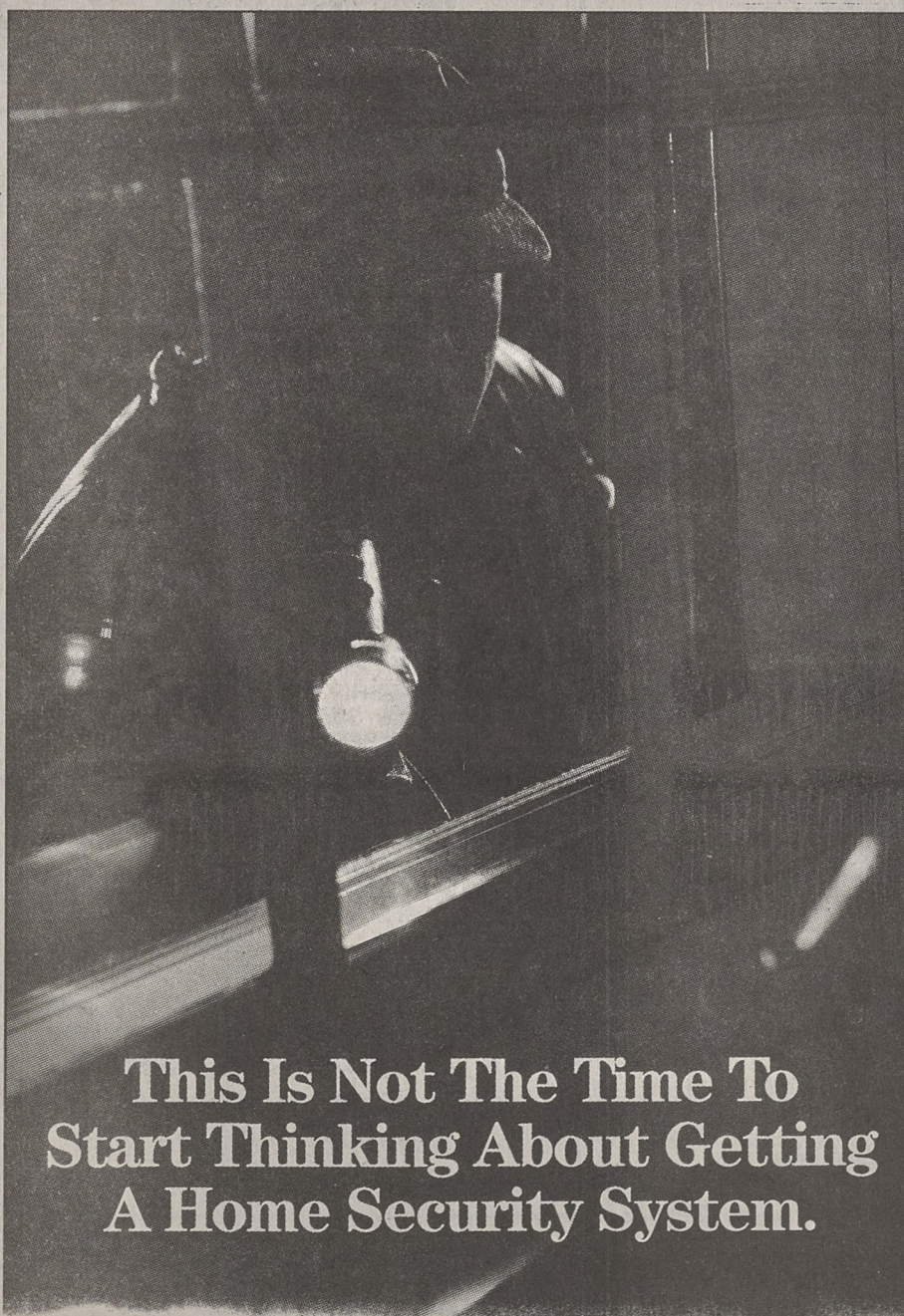
1 tablespoon vanilla
3 eggs, beaten
1 cup shredded coconut

6 to 8 large ripe bananas
Chopped pecans and walnuts (optional)

Mix sugar and flour in a heavy saucepan. Add milk and vanilla, beating until smooth. Cook over low heat, stirring continually until it begins to thicken. Add eggs and coconut to sauce. Bring sauce back to

140 degrees for 3 minutes, stirring continually. Remove from heat.

Assemble immediately when sauce is prepared. Slice cake into thin slices. In 9 x 13 inch pan, make a single layer with half the cake slices. Slice 4 bananas, and spread over cake. Pour half of the hot Coconut Sauce over bananas. Repeat layers of cake, bananas, and end with Coconut Sauce. Sprinkle with nuts if desired. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours before serving. Yield 10-12 servings.
