huckleberry, blueberry, sparkleberry, and lichen. The ground juniper, which gave the ridge its name, is only found in one other location in North Carolina.

Animal species that Sox said inhabited the connector land includes deer, turkey, skunks and rattlesnakes.

"Rattlers need wilderness and they are endangered," Sox said. "Seeing a rattlesnake is a treat."

Now that Crowders Mountain State Park has come into possession of the new wilderness area, Sox said that planning for the future in a careful way was imperative.

'We are currently working on a master plan for use of the connector," Sox said. "We hope to turn out a document next winter that will address the issues of facilities and resources." Sox said that planning for the future was vital because the number of visitors that come to **Crowders Mountain State Park** increases each year by four to five percent. Currently, the park sees about 300,000 folks each year. Incorporating Davidson and City lakes near Kings Mountain into the overall park plan was also something Sox said he would like to see

According to Sox, interest in the connector land has been high. Beside's Sunday's exploration, another hike to an area known as "The Boulders" will take place Saturday, February 17 from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. The group will be limited to 25 hikers.
