Shrine golf tourney June 16 at KMCC


The White Plains Shrine Club will host its annual golf tournament Saturday, June 16 at 7:30 a.m. at Kings Mountain Country Club.

The Cobras team is composed of players from all Cleveland County middle schools and a player from R-S Central Middle School.


First Wesleyan still unbeaten in softball


