# Bicycle helmet law goes into effect on October 1

The City of Kings Mountain Police Department recently received a grant to promote children's bicycle safety.

The Department received a \$2,000 grant funded from the federal government and the North Carolina Department of Transportation for approximately 286 bicycle helmets for chil-

"I think its good for the kids safety," Police Chief Houston Corn said. "The more protection they have the better off

The new law, scheduled to be in effect October 1 would have several new provisions in it:

• Any parent or guardian who fails to require a child under 16 to wear a helmet while riding a bicycle will be fined

 All bicycle passengers who weigh less than 40 pounds or are less than 40 inches in height must be seated in separate restraining seats. • No person who is unable to

maintain a straight, seated position shall be a passenger in a bicycle restraining seat.

 All bicycle passengers must be seated on saddle seats.

Dr. Bob Harris, Chief Medical Officer for Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina said helmet costs range from \$10 to \$20. Helmets are available in many chain stores, bicycle shops, sporting good stores, and toy stores.

Harris:

• Choose a helmet in bright

• Make sure the helmet is ventilated, since the foam holds heat in.

• Check the fit in the store. Place the helmet on the child's head and adjust the straps and pads. The helmets should sit level on the child's head and fit securely with the strap fas-

· Make sure the helmet carries a sticker that reads, CPSC, ASTM, Snell B-95, or N-94. These codes signify the helmet is appropriate for use as a child's bicycle helmet.

 Most child helmets come with two to three sets of foam fitting pads. As the child's head grows the thicker pads can be replaced with thinner pads. The fitting pads do not affect the impact protection of the helmet.

 Always replace a helmet when a child is in an accident. Even if your child does not think he or she hit their head, inspect the helmet for damage or signs of impact. Even minor dents or scratches may be signs that the impact has crushed portions of the foam, making the helmet less protective.

• Be sure to teach your child to remove his or her helmet when finished riding. Always have the child remove their helmet before using playground equipment or climbing trees
