KM Fire Department lists cold weather tips

With winter weather approaching the Kings Mountain Fire Department has issued cold weather safety tips.

• Have heaters checked by an authorized dealer.

• Home heating devices need a 36 inch clearance from combustibles.

• When using space heaters, always read the owner's manual and operate according to factory recommendations.

• Portable kerosene heaters must be fueled only in a wellventilated area, free of flames and only when the device has cooled completely. Use only the type of kerosene specified by the manufacturer for that device, and never use gasoline instead of kerosene. Also, be sure that portable kerosene heaters are legal home use in your community.

• Always fuel heaters outside.

• Never use drop cords to power electric heaters or appliances.

• Never go to bed with space heaters lit or left on.

Check smoke detectors

weekly and install smoke detectors in all sleeping areas.

• Plan an escape rout, know two ways out, and have a special meeting place.

• When heating with fuel have a carbon monoxide detector installed.

• When using candles, make sure they are not near any combustibles or plants that may be ignited.

• Place candles on large candleholders to prevent them from being knocked over.

• Place candles at the center of tables to avoid possible burns.

• Never use flammable liquids to prime wicks.

• For churches, have someone responsible for collecting candles and placing them outside in a metal container.

The Fire Department will install batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Smoke detectors are also available for the elderly or anyone who can not afford to purchase one.

Job market will be soft but steady

A soft but steady job market awaits Cleveland County this winter, based on results of Manpower's First Quarter 2002 Employment Outlook Survey.

The report, indicates 17 percent of firms interviewed expect their payrolls to increase in the new year, 10 percent say fewer workers will be needed, and 73 percent intend to stay at current levels.

"In the survey of three months ago employers were more hopeful when 17 percent anticipated staffing up and 3 percent saw reductions," Pat Bailey of Manpower said.

"A year ago conditions were favorable for the January-March period as 33 percent planned work force additions, while 13 percent predicted cutbacks," she said.

In the first quarter, job creation is expected in construction, education, and services. Expectations are mixed in
