# **Red Cross receives grant** to help fund KM center

The Cleveland County Red Cross has been awarded a \$75,000 grant by the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust of Winston-Salem for its "Second Century Campaign."

The funds will be used to equip and furnish two new blood collection centers, one in Shelby and another in Kings Mountain. The Shelby facility will be built on a four-acre tract of land on Fallston Road and will serve as the Chapter headquarters. The Kings Mountain office will be located in the downtown area near the library and historical museum. Both locations will offer a full range of Red Cross services including health and safety education and disaster relief services, according to Executive Director Rick Dancy.

'Never has the need for blood been greater than it has been during the past year and we expect the need to continue to increase in years to come," said Dancy. "Having our own blood collection centers here in Cleveland County will make it more convenient for our donors and more cost effective for the Red Cross. The grant from Kate B. Reynolds will give us the additional resources we needed to meet this growing need."

Founded in 1971, the Cleveland County Red Cross serves one out of every nine families in the County each year. The Chapter has ranked as one of the top performing blood collection programs in the nation for five consecutive years and the new blood centers will help the Chapter maintain its leadership role in the Red Cross bio-medical system.

A volunteer Board of Directors made up of 24 people representing all areas of Cleveland County governs the Chapter. Chair of the Board of Directors is Bruce Putnam of PPG.

the Cleveland County Red Cross launched its 'Second Century Campaign" in February to raise one million dollars to upgrade its facilities.

The Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust was created in 1947 by the will of Mrs. William N. Reynolds of Winston-Salem. Three-fourths of the income from the trust is designated for use for health-related programs and services across North Carolina and one-fourth for the poor and needy of Winston-Salem and Forsyth County.
