Kerns receives Silver Beaver Award

Butch Kerns of Kings Mountain was one of six top volunteers receiving the Silver Beaver Award by the Piedmont Council, Boy Scouts of America, at its 79th annual Volunteer Recognition Banquet held February 20 at the Lincolnton Citizens Center in Lincolnton.

The Silver Beaver Award is given to volunteer Scouters for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth. It is the highest honor a local Boy Scout Council can bestow upon an adult volunteer.

The Council awards the Silver Beaver based on service and outstanding performance as a volunteer Scouter. The Piedmont Council covers 11

counties in Western North Carolina, serving over 18,042 youth and 5,000 adult volunteers.

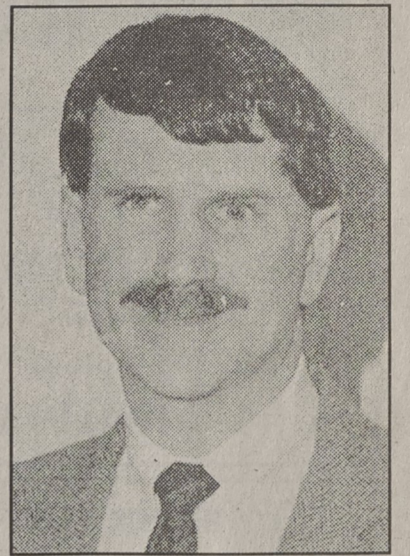
On the unit level, he serves as a Cub Scout Den Leader for Pack 21 chartered by Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Gastonia.

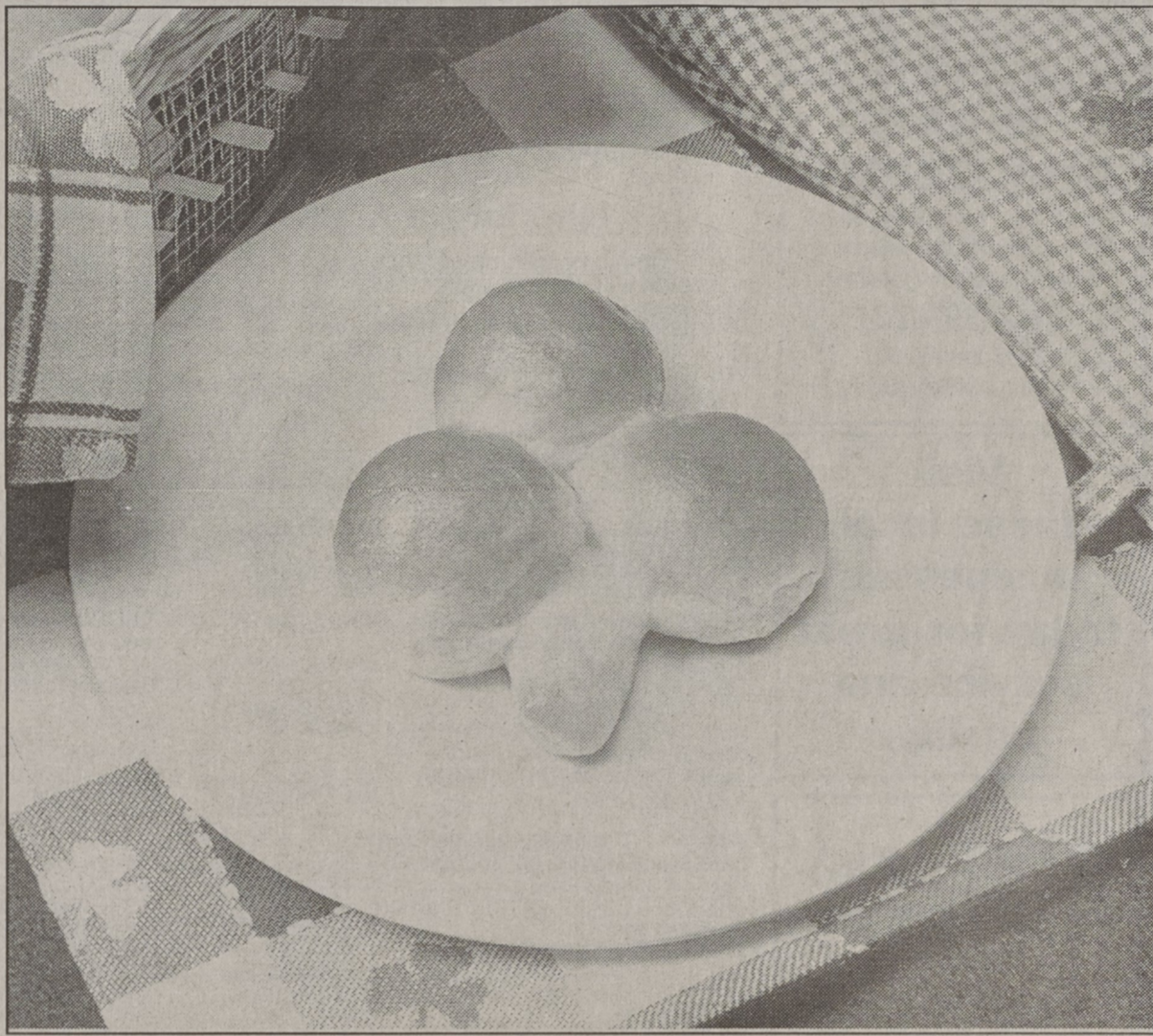
Kerns and his wife, Donna, reside in Gastonia. They have two children, Anna, 11, and Wil, a Cub Scout, who is 7.

Shamrock Roll unique dish for St. Patrick's Day

Put some fun in St. Patrick's Day with unique tasting Shamrock Roll

Bake some fun this St. Patrick's Day. The recipe is made with the convenience of Bridgford Frozen Roll or Bread Dough. Tender yeast dough is formed into the shape of clovers. Let the dough rise until double in size and then bake! A fun addition to any meal!

Shamrock Rolls

1 package Bridgford Frozen White Rolls, thawed or 1 loaf Bridgford Frozen Bread Dough, thawed
1/4 cup melted butter or margarine

Lightly grease a large baking sheet(s); set aside. If using loaf of dough, divide thawed loaf into 12 equal slices. Rolls are ready to use once thawed. Place rolls or dough pieces on a lightly floured surface. Divide each piece of dough into 3 large pieces and 1 small piece. (The three larger pieces

will be the clover and the smaller piece will be the stem.) With floured hands, roll the three larger pieces into balls and place in shamrock pattern on prepared baking sheet(s). Shape the smaller piece of dough into a rectangle and place as a stem pin between the three balls of dough. Repeat with remaining pieces of dough. Brush shamrocks with melted butter or margarine. Let rise until double in size. Bake in a preheated 375-degree oven for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from oven and brush with remaining melted butter. Remove from pan to cool on wire rack.

Yield: 12-18 rolls.
