Two fund-raising efforts to help with the medical expenses of 2-year-old Dalton Johnson are scheduled in Kings Mountain.

Dalton has been diagnosed with Hurler Syndrome, a disease characterized by an enlarged liver and spleen, persistent rhinitis, coarse facial features, corneal clouding, claw hands and coronary artery stenosis, bone deformities, hydrocephalus and progressive retardation.

Most children with the disease die by the age of 10.

Dalton recently underwent a second bone marrow transplant at Duke University Medical Center in Durham. His medical bills are "tremendous," according to his physician in Durham, Mahmoud Mustafa, MD.
