park will provide uniforms, accoutrements and training. Men and women are both welcome to join the militia, as are families.

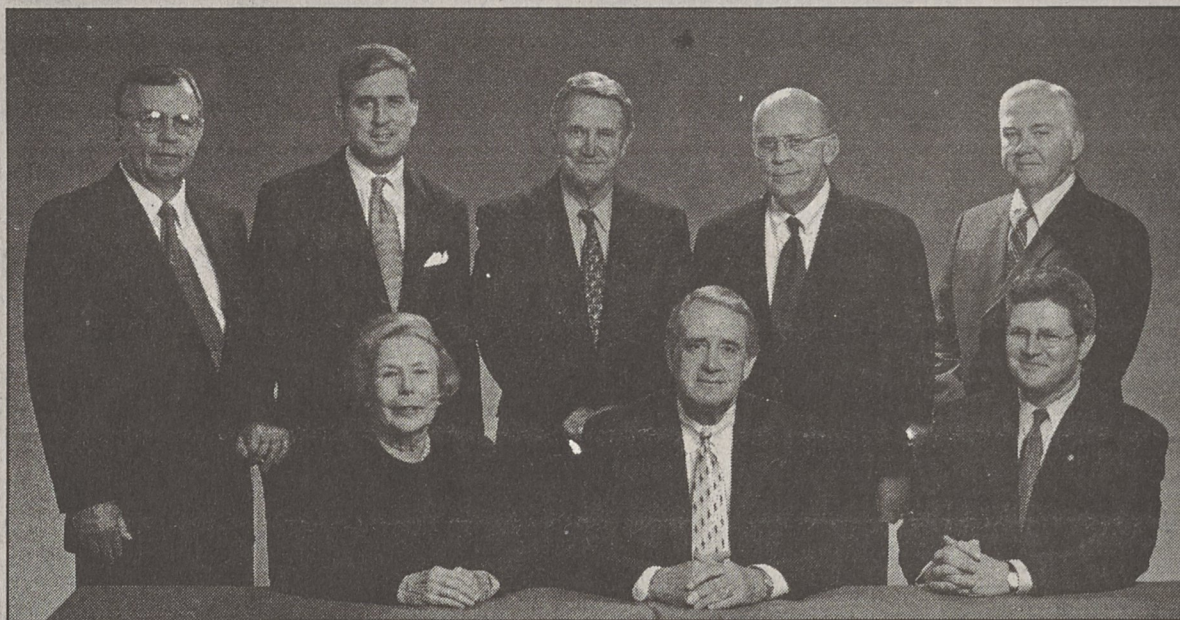
