Approximately 25 employees of the two Grover plants will lose their jobs with most of them leaving on Friday, according to Cleveland County N.C. Employment Security **Commission** Office Manager Antwon Keith.

The displaced workers will have usual benefits available to them such as COBRA, according to Ken Warshefki, human resources manager at the company's headquarters. There will be no severance for the displaced workers, he said.

Two of the displaced workers will be assigned to an affiliate plant in Mississippi, Warshefki said.

"We're just trying to consolidate and trying to hold the company together," he said.

Some of the company's main customers have not been ordering at their usual levels, he said.
