

# Lady Cobras win Raleigh tourney

The 1984 Lady Cobra Classic soccer team won the CASL labor Day Challenge last weekend in Raleigh. Although the weather was extremely wet, the Cobras won two of their three round robin matches in regulation and won the other on penalty kicks.

The Lady Cobras defeated the Raleigh Blast 2-0 in the first game. The field conditions were so wet that the ball often stopped dead in the water.

Lesley Potter scored for the Cobras in the first half, and Stephanie Edwards scored in the second half when the field was almost entirely saturated with water.

Due to near continuous driving rains, the second match against the Raleigh Five was determined by each team taking five penalty kicks. Keeper Stacey Spicer made three fantastic saves as four Cobras converted on their chances. Scoring on the penalty kicks were Lesley Potter, Stephanie Edwards, Emily Edwards and Sara Sipe.

The Cobras' third match was against the Greensboro Flamingos, with the winner advancing to the championship match later in the day. Potter scored the lone goal of the first half, and
