for a 6-0 lead.

But, East Gaston came right back with a methodical running and passing game that set the stage for the rest of the contest. The Warriors used the running of Abernathy and the running and passing of Moore to launch an 86-yard touchdown drive that took six minutes off the clock. Moore covered the final 11 yards on a quarterback sneak to tie the game.

Kings Mountain moved the ball to the East Gaston 34, but Deon Holland and Cortney Smith, both of whom were wide open, dropped perfect passes from quarterback Derek Smith and the drive stalled.

It was all East Gaston after that.

The Warriors missed a short field goal on their next drive, and then recovered a fumble at the KM 31. On the second play, Moore threw a lateral pass to wide receiver Michael Sanchez, who was a part-time starting quarterback for the Warriors last year, and Sanchez found Hogan wide open in the end zone for a 36-yard touchdown pass. Blake Stoddard kicked the extra point for a 13-6 East Gaston lead.

Abernathy tacked on a 17-yard touchdown run with

1:09 left in the half to put the Warriors on top 20-6, but Kings Mountain came right back and got a 57-yard touchdown pass from Derek Smith to Cortney Smith, and a PAT from Pablo Peralta, to cut the margin to 20-13 at halftime.

East Gaston took the second half kickoff and drove in for a 24-yard field goal by Stoddard to widen the gap to 23-13 before Simmons capped a 73-yard drive with a 12-yard run off tackle to make it 23-20.

However, Abernathy returned the ensuing kickoff 56 yards to the KM 36 yard line, and three plays later Moore circled right end for an 11-yard touchdown run to close out the scoring.

The victory by the Warriors broke a nine-game losing streak to the Mounties, tracing back to 1984 when East Gaston left the old Southwestern 3A Conference for the 4A ranks. The teams renewed their rivalry in 1993 as a non-conference series and during that span KM had won every game while outscoring the Warriors 328-81.

Red Cross golf tourney slated
