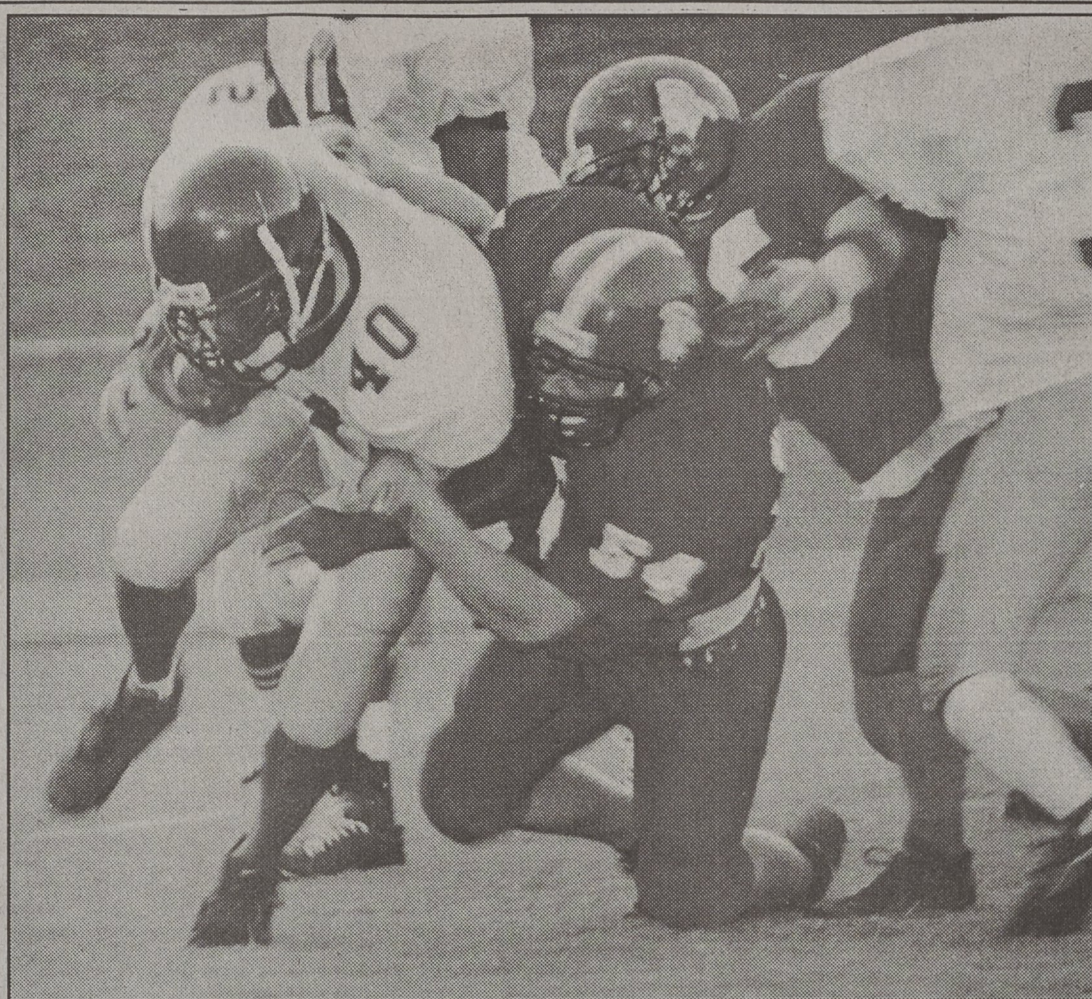

"We saw some things that we did well, but we also saw some things we need to improve on," said Coach Farquharson. "We knew we had to go in there and play responsibility football. I think our guys early were able to do that because we were able to answer a score with a score and at one point had the game close.

"But South Point was real patient. We challenged our defense to come out and make some stops in the second half and they did, but offensively we weren't able to capitalize like we should have. We had some breakdowns that didn't help us. When you

get into trading touchdowns for touchdowns and you're one or two behind, you need a turnover or a break to get you back close where you can keep it even."

Although they trailed 26-14 at the half, the Mountaineers had some breaks early in the second half but they couldn't take advantage of them. Cedric Hunter recovered a Red Raider fumble at the 47, but three plays later KM had to punt.

Four plays later Brown broke loose on a 65-yard touchdown run which gave South Point a 33-14 lead and took what little spark they had out of the Mountaineers. South Point scored two more times early in the fourth quarter and led 47-14 before KM finally dented the scoreboard again late in the fourth quarter.

"Forestview's going to be pretty much a carbon copy of South Point," says KM coach David Farquharson. "Coach Lee was instrumental in putting that offense in over at South Point when he was an assistant there. They're going to approach the game in the same manner as South Point. They're

going to be patient and will continue to run their offense regardless of what you do."

Farquharson, who despite the lop-sided score says he saw improvement on both offense and defense last week, hopes a couple of moves up front will help the Mountaineers' cause. Guard Drew Gibson, who missed the first two games after having appendix surgery, will start at guard, allowing senior standout Johnny

Gilliard to move over to the defensive line.

"Johnny came to the offense last year from defense because of the depth we had on defense," Farquharson explained. "Now, we have a good little corp of young offensive line-men who are playing pretty well so we're able to give the defense back a senior who will be able to come in there and give them some time and work."

Even though he sat out the fourth quarter of last week's game after taking a hard hit to his elbow, Farquharson said KM's starting quarterback Derek Smith should be in the lineup this week. Last year's starting QB, Chris Jolly, moved over from wide receiver to take over for Smith late in the game last week and played well.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

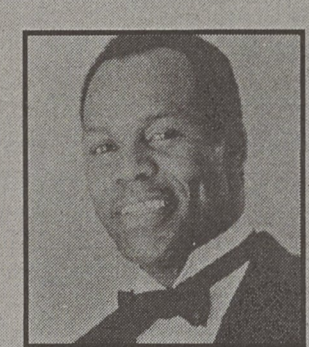
