14-0 lead on a 25-yard pass from Chris Rayfield to Carroll, and a 6-yard run by J.R. Armstrong.

KM battled back to tie the score at 14-14 on Jolly touchdown passes of 13 yards to Deon Holland 45 yards to Jamarl Borrino.

But the Forestview offense, which had been held in check by the improving KM defense in the middle two quarters, took the ensuing kickoff and marched right downfield to score the go-ahead touchdown on a 20-yard pass from Rayfield to Carroll.

"I thought we did a lot of good things," Farquharson said. "We saw some areas of improvement. We felt like we got a quality effort from our kids for four quarters, which was something we hadn't been doing in the past."

"But, at the same time the mental mistakes and turnovers cost us. They cost us an opportunity to go ahead and they cost us an opportunity to kind of take a little of the wind out of their sails."

Farquharson said he was well pleased with the team effort, though, and said the enthusiasm and spirit shown by the players was "10 times better than it was against

South Point and East Gaston."

"So I think we have something we can build on," he said. "From a team standpoint we had everybody making plays and everybody contributing. Kids were coming up and making plays that we weren't making before and they were doing things unselfishly. When you get everybody on that page you're going to make that turn sooner or later."

Farquharson said he was especially pleased with the play of Cortney Smith, who caught four passes for 51 yards and rushed six times for 28 yards, and defenders Adrian Parker and Brandon Houze, who were in on numerous tackles.

"This game was probably one of their best games as far as them doing what they're capable of doing and what we'd like to see them doing every week," Farquharson said. "They played a tremendous ball game."

and last year's All-Conference quarterback Shawn Haynes will be the focus of Kings Mountain's defense.

"We're going to have to play as good on defense, if not better, than we did last week," says Farquharson. "We're going to have to continue to improve on that side of the ball."

Kings Mountain's defense is young, with only two starters back from last season, but they've shown some progress since being upset by East Gaston in their season opener.

One player who is stepping up his game a level is senior linebacker Adrian Parker, who made numerous tackles last week along with linebackers Brandon Houze and Orlando Curry and lineman Johnny Gillard.

"We had the kind of outside linebacker play out of Parker that we know he's capable of doing," Farquharson said. "We were tickled to death to see him play as well as he did. Hopefully the light will come on now and it will be something he can continue to do."

Offensively, Farquharson said the Mountaineers will have to eliminate their turnovers (they had two fumbles and two passes intercepted last week), and also cut out the penalties that cost them on numerous occasions, including erasing a 72-yard touchdown run by Deon Holland.

Both Shelby and Kings Mountain open their conference seasons next week. Shelby travels to Chase and Kings Mountain hosts Fred T. Foard.
