Hayley Flynn of Kings Mountain won the Southwestern Foothills Conference cross country meet Thursday with a time of 20:22.

Flynn will face the Big South Conference champion, Monica Pletzer of Forestview, in the Western 3A Regional meet October 26 in Kings Mountain.

Flynn's winning time helped lead the Lady Mountaineers to second place behind a balanced R-S Central team. R-S finished with 34 points, followed by

KM 66, St. Stephens 90, Fred T. Foard 102, Hickory 112, Burns 149, and Crest 164.

R-S Central runners took second and third place, with Katie Guffey finishing in 20:55 and Ginny Haden 21:02.

Kings Mountain and R-S each had three top ten finishers. Susie Potter ran ninth for the Mountaineers with a time of 22:28, and Raquel Welsh was 10th in 22:44.

Sloane McDaniel 44th.

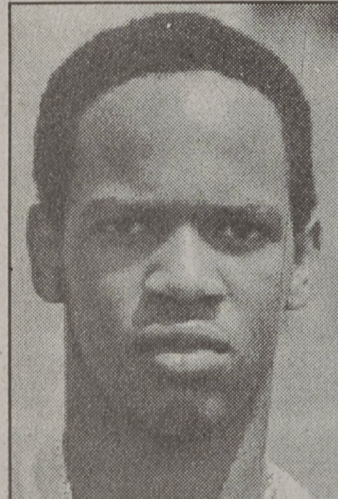
Hickory won the boys race with 33 points, followed by R-S 37, St. Stephens 109, KM 115, Foard 131, Burns 149, and Crest 170.

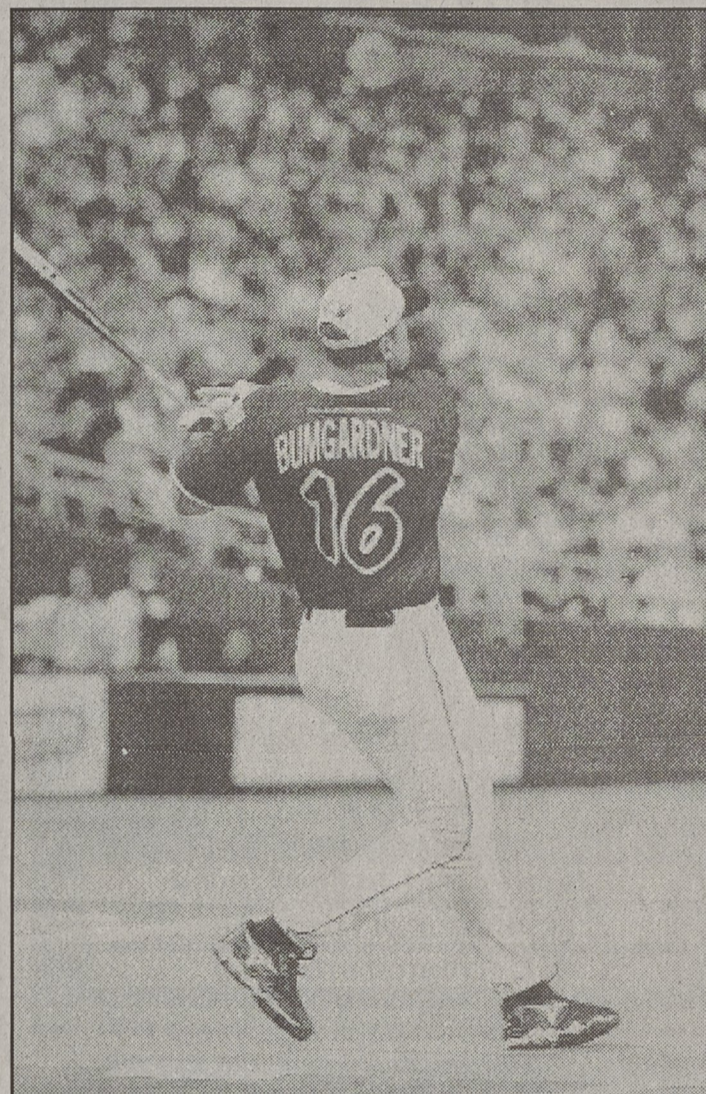
Regionals championship game is scheduled for October 29, and the State championship game is November 2 at NC State University.

Alex Dawson had eight kills, Danielle Gill two and LaRonda McClain one.

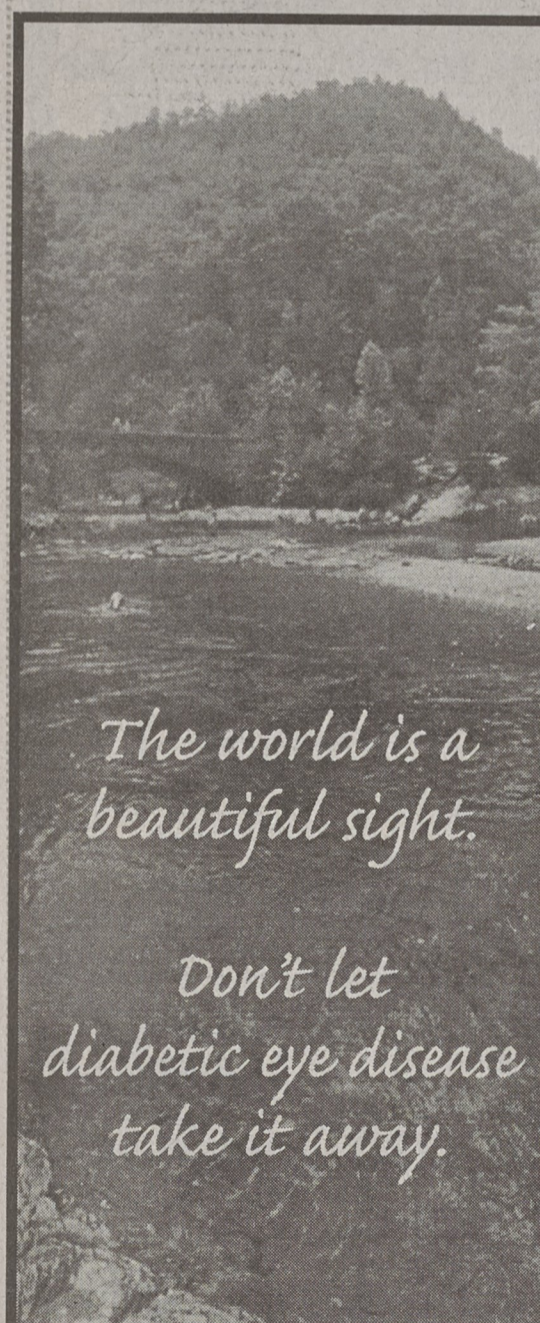
