## **Mounties at Glenn Friday** in first round of 3AA playoffs

Kings Mountain's Mountaineers will make their first trip to the State 3AA playoffs since 1998 Friday when they travel to Kernersville to take on Glenn High's Bobcats.

The Mountaineers go into the game with a 4-7 overall record and the #4 team from the Southwestern Foothills Conference. Glenn, ranked 9th in the State 3A polls, is 9-2 overall and #2 in the Piedmont Triad. Glenn is seeded #4 and KM #13.

The Mountaineers, whose record isn't indicative of their potential, hope to catch a Glenn team on a slide. The Bobcats won their first nine games before dropping back-toback conference games to Greensboro Smith and WinstonSalem Conference to end the regular season.

The 35-7 loss last week to Carver, the top-seed in the Western 3A bracket, was devastating to the Bobcats in more ways than the final score. Coach Dick Cline's charges lost perhaps their best all-around player in wide receiver Chris Lane, who tore is ACL.

"He was a big weapon for us," said Coach Cline. "He was our go-to guy at receiver, as well as our kickoff and return guy."

Kings Mountain will be lining up against a team that is similar to the traditional power teams of this area. The Bobcats run out of the I-formation on offense and run an 8-man front on defense.

"You could compare us to a Virginia Tech," Cline said. "We're not an upfield team; we're not a stunt and gambling team like what you see in today's style."

Glenn's leading rusher is sophomore tailback Shawn Moore, a 5-11, 180-pounder who has over 1,400 yards rushing and 23 touchdowns.

Chris'Lane's twin brother, Corey, is an experienced quarterback and the team's most versatile player. He started at quarterback last year and played tailback and wide receiver earlier this year. However, in the middle of the season the Bobcats' starting quarterback was dismissed from the team and Lane was moved back to his old spot.

"We tried to utilize him in a lot of different ways because of his versatility," Cline said.

Cline said he is impressed with Kings Mountain's athletic ability and expects a tough game Friday.

"Kings Mountain is very athletic...very quick," he said. "They have a lot of skill players and a lot of athletic players at all positions. They're a very good football team."

The KM-Glenn winner will advance to the second round against the winner of the #5 Ashbrook vs. #12 Weddington game. Throughout the playoffs the higher-seeded team is the home team.

The last time the Mountaineers qualified for the State playoffs they went all the way to the Championship Game in Chapel Hill before losing 34-28 to Winston-Salem Carver on a touchdown pass in the final three minutes.

### **Mounties** open at Garinger Tuesday

Only two of those players, guard Dashawn Young and forward Gabe Blair, have lany varsity playing experience.

Others who will be starting include guard Caleb Crosby, wing Heath Walker, and forward D.J. Byrd.

The only four players available for back-up duty are Quincy Johnson, Terry Lipscomb, Michael Burris and Brandon McClain.

Once the football season is over, point guard Derrick Smith and inside players Brandon Houze, Cortney Smith and Tae Tae Roebuck will join the squad.

"I'm curious to see how this young group of kids is going to accept the challenge," said McDowell. "Last year by this time I had my gunners, but now you're talking about it taking them at least three more weeks to get in basketball shape. By the time they get here we could have already played four or five games.

Although his players are young, they certainly don't lack in enthusiasm, McDowell said.

"The effort is there, every day in practice," he said. "But I'm asking these young guys to lead our team before they follow. It's a

## **Mounties whip Cats** in endowment game

Kings Mountain's Mountaineers closed out their regular season Friday night at North Gaston with a 28-16 win over the Wildcats in a NCHSAA endowment game.

The win gave the Mounties a 4-7 overall record heading into the State 3AA playoffs this Friday at Kernersville Glenn. North Gaston finished 1-10.

Coach Dave Farquharson of the Mounties used the game to rest some of his players that have been experiencing injuries, including leading rusher Aquino Simmons and linebackers Josh Etters and Orlando Curry.

Both teams tried to establish a run-

ning game, but neither was highly successful. Kings Mountain managed only 103 yards rushing in 47 carries and North Gaston had 117 in 22 attempts.

The difference was the passing game, where KM's Chris Jolly hit 13 of 21 passes for 192 yards and three touchdowns. North Gaston sophomore Jeff Johnson connected on 12 of 17 for 113 yards.

The game was in doubt until late in the third quarter, when the Mountaineers scored the first of two unanswered touchdowns that broke a 16-all tie.

Junior wide receiver Derrick Smith caught four passes for 69 yards, including touchdowns of 30 yards (first quarter) and 14 yards (second quarter).

North Gaston answered Smith's first

TD reception with a 26-yard field goal by Joshua Putnam, and a 21-yard pass from Johnson to Britt Bates for a 9-7 lead. Smith's second TD reception put the Mounties up by 13-9, and Pablo Peralta, who saw only limited action because of an injury, tacked on a 27yard field goal to put KM up 16-9.

North Gaston's sophomore tailback Rafael Littlejohn broke up the middle for a 53-yard touchdown run to tie the score at 16-all early in the third quarter.

Montrell Banks, who gained 100 yards in 31 carries, scored from oneyard out to give KM the lead at 22-16 late in the third quarter, and tight end Adrian Parker caught a 15-yard touchdown pass for an insurance tally in the fourth quarter.
